What is the Vermont Prescription Monitoring System?

- A statewide electronic database of controlled substance prescriptions dispensed from Vermont-licensed pharmacies that became operational in January 2009
 - Vermont-licensed pharmacies upload data every 24 hours
- A clinical tool to promote the appropriate prescribing of controlled substances and deter misuse, abuse, and diversion of controlled substances
- In June 2017, VPMS transitioned to a new platform, PMP AWARE
 - PMP AWARE is active in 42 states and territories
 - The new system allows for the integration of provider tools and regular system-wide updates



Prescriber Registration

Registration Outreach

- Outreach to unregistered prescribers of controlled substances completed in March 2018
- In March and April, 679 new prescribers were registered
 - □ Currently estimated >85% registration compliant
 - Follow-up letter to go out in early June

□ VA Prescriber Role Access

- Prescribers at the VA who do not have a Vermont license were not able to register for VPMS, despite treating Vermonters
- In March 2018, a new role was created for VA prescribers, allowing them VPMS access



Prescriber Resource Development

Prescriber Insight Reports

- Quarterly reports of a prescriber's opioid prescribing practices covering six month intervals
- Available to prescribers with active VPMS accounts
- Allows prescribers to compare their own prescribing practices with similar prescribers




VPMS Access and Querying

- VPMS allows sharing with seven states in the northeast
- Only provider types
 allowed by both states can
 query the system.




Number of System Queries by Month



Gap is due to reporting capabilities
 through two system platform changes –
 queries continued during those times



Total MME Opioid Analgesics per 100 Residents began to decrease after S.243 was signed and prior to implementation




There was a 28% decrease in MME/100 people between Q1 2016 and Q1 2018
