10-Year Vision Includes

- New, campus-style facility of up to 925 beds
 - Would allow out of state offenders to return
 - Could include a location for youthful offenders, if Medicaid funding is not secured for Woodside
 - 30 beds for DOC acute psychiatric care; non-hospital level
 - 20 forensic beds for hospital level of care (DMH operated)

- Includes the closure of two facilities:
 Chittenden and Northwest
 - Plan that was modeled in the report leaves the remaining correctional facilities open (Marble Valley, Springfield, St. Johnsbury, and Newport)
- Plan that was modeled assumes the campus can be built in stages, with one or two units coming online every two years until it is complete in 2028

Up to 925 bed campus in Northwest Vermont

457 beds for male offenders (including out-of-state offenders)

175 beds for female offenders

120 beds for Federal offenders (revenue producing)

30 booking and receiving beds

50 ADA compliant beds for aging/infirm inmates

30 beds for DOC acute psychiatric care (non-hospital level)

18 infirmary beds, including 2 hospice and 3 quarantine beds Woodside Plan B:

25 beds for youthful offenders

The original facilities plan included space for up to 25 youthful offender beds if Woodside did not secure Medicaid funding.

Act 190 of 2018 appropriated \$500,000 for design documents and planning for a new Woodside on the current site.

Separate part of campus:

20 forensic beds for hospital level of care, provided by DMH
