2. How long is their sentence?

Sentence data is difficult to calculate. As proxy measure the data below shows the average number of years from between today (9/12/18) and a minimum and maximum release date for sentenced individuals held past the minimum release date.

42.% of inmates held past the minimum release date for lack of housing have serious felony offenses such as: Aggravated Domestic Assault, Aggravated Sexual Assault, Sexual Assault, and Assault and Robbery with a Weapon.

Historically, many of the offenders held past their minimum are violent offenders who are at a moderate to very high risk to recidivate. Additionally, criminal justice involved individuals face the same barriers (employment, child care, poverty) as many other Vermonters, with the addition of a criminal history. Vermont has a housing shortage, making affordable housing a major barrier for reentering

individuals. Many of those held for lack of housing have been previously released and returned for violating conditions, new crimes, or loss of housing.
