Drug and alcohol testing provides an accurate, timely, and comprehensive assessment of unauthorized substance use throughout participants' enrollment in the Drug Court.

A Frequent Testing			
Drug and alcohol testing is performed frequently enough to ensure substance use is detected quickly and reliably			
Urine testing is not performed in 7 day blocks Tests measuring substance use over extended periods of time (SCRAM) are applied for at least ninety consecutive days followed by urine or other intermittent testing methods			
Tests that have short detection windows (breathalyzers or oral fluid tests) are administered when substance use is more likely to occur			
Tests that have short detection windows (breathalyzers or oral fluid tests) are administered when recent substance use is suspected			
B Random Testing			
Drug and alcohol testing is random and unpredictable (28% chance of being tested on any day of the week)			
The probability of being tested on weekends and holidays is the same as on other days			

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Participants receive a clear and comprehensive written explanation of their rights and responsibilities related to drug and alcohol testing
