

No. R-49. House concurrent resolution honoring Tufts University Medical Center neurosurgery chair Dr. Carl B. Heilman.

Whereas, Dr. Carl Heilman is a respected neurosurgeon among his professional peers, and

Whereas, he is a graduate of Allegheny College and the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine where he served as class president during his third year, and

Whereas, after graduation, Dr. Carl Heilman completed his neurosurgical residency at the Tufts University Medical Center, serving as chief resident before completing advance training in skull surgery at the University of Tennessee, and

Whereas, in 1994, the impressed senior neurosurgeons at Tufts Medical Center hired Dr. Carl Heilman as a neurosurgery faculty member, and

Whereas, over the past 23 years, Dr. Carl Heilman has been a prolific author of medical journal articles and book chapters on neurosurgery topics, and

Whereas, in 2005, he was appointed chair of neurosurgery at Tufts Medical Center, and

Whereas, as a recognized neurosurgery leader, Dr. Carl Heilman has served as president of several local and national professional organizations, and

Whereas, his surgical abilities are truly remarkable as he performs multiple-hour brain surgery that is extraordinarily challenging and technically complex, now therefore be it
