<u>Whereas</u>, during the second decade of the 20th century, two philanthropic members of the Putnam Family, Henry W. Putnam and Henry W. Putnam Jr., recognized that the lack of a hospital in Bennington County limited access to health care services in southwestern Vermont, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the Putnams decided improved health care was essential in southwestern Vermont, and they financed the construction of a 35-bed hospital that opened on June 10, 1918 and was known as the Putnam Memorial Hospital, and

<u>Whereas</u>, nurse Mary Baker oversaw the hospital's administration for its first quartercentury, including a major reconstruction project following a devastating fire in 1933, and

<u>Whereas</u>, starting in 1955 and through the early 1990s, various infrastructure projects introduced or enhanced ambulatory and emergency services, cancer care, intensive care, long-term care, radiation therapy, and surgical care, improving the hospital's facilities to introduce advances in medical technology and meet the community's evolving health care requirements, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 1984, the hospital was renamed the Southwestern Vermont Medical Center and the Putnam Memorial Health Corporation was established as its parent organization; in 2000, the corporation was renamed Southwestern Vermont Health Care; and in 2012, Dartmouth-Hitchcock Putnam Physicians was established, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Southwestern Vermont Medical Center is one of only 43 hospitals worldwide to have achieved four designations as a Magnet Center for Nursing Excellence; and in 2017, it received the Magnet Prize, an award for extraordinary innovation that annually only one U.S. hospital receives, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 2017, Southwestern Vermont Medical Center was also awarded the 5-Star Rating for quality patient safety, and patient experience from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, making it the only 5-Star hospital in Vermont, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 2018, in celebration of its centennial, Southwestern Vermont Medical Center is publishing a commemorative book, presenting a medical artifacts exhibit, and conducting a festive community day, now therefore be it
