7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to:
8	(1) clarify the authority and process for removing certain vehicles or
9	cargo from a highway under specified circumstances; and
10	(2) limit the liability of a person acting at the direction of an
11	enforcement officer who removes from a highway a vehicle or cargo that is
12	obstructing traffic or maintenance activities or is creating a hazard to traffic.

14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 1102 is amended to read:
16	§ 1102. REMOVAL OF STOPPED VEHICLES
17	(a) Any enforcement officer is authorized to:
18	(1) move a vehicle stopped, parked, or standing contrary to section 1101
19	of this title, or to require the driver or other person in charge to move the
20	vehicle to a position off the paved or main-traveled part of the highway;

1	(2) remove an unattended vehicle which is an obstruction to traffic or to
2	maintenance of the highway to a garage or other place of safety;
3	(3) remove any vehicle found upon a highway, as defined in 19 V.S.A.
4	§ 1, to a garage or other place of safety when:
5	(A) the officer is informed by a reliable source that the vehicle has
6	been stolen or taken without the consent of its owner; or
7	(B) the person in charge of the vehicle is unable to provide for its
8	removal; or
9	(C) the person in charge of the vehicle has been arrested under
10	circumstances which require his or her immediate removal from control of the
11	vehicle.
12	(b) Any enforcement officer causing the removal of a motor vehicle under
13	this section shall notify the Department as to the location and date of discovery
14	of the vehicle, date of removal of the vehicle, name of the towing service
15	removing the vehicle, and place of storage. The officer shall record and
16	remove from the vehicle, if possible, any information which might aid the
17	Department in ascertaining the ownership of the vehicle and forward it to the
18	Department. A motor vehicle towed under authority of this section may qualify
19	as an abandoned motor vehicle under subchapter 7 of chapter 21 of this title.

2	§ 1604. SEIZURE, REMOVAL OF MOTOR VEHICLES, CARGO, OR
3	STOLEN VEHICLES; LIMITATION ON LIABILITY
4	(a) An enforcement officer is authorized to:
5	(1) cause the removal of a motor vehicle stopped, parked, or standing
6	contrary to section 1101 of this title, or require the driver or other person in
7	charge to move the vehicle in accordance with law;
8	(2) cause the removal of an unattended motor vehicle or cargo that is
9	obstructing traffic or maintenance of the highway or is creating a hazard to
10	traffic;
11	(3) cause the removal of a motor vehicle or cargo upon a highway, as
12	defined in 19 V.S.A. § 1 when:
13	(A) the person in charge of the vehicle or cargo is unable to provide
14	for its removal; or
15	(B) the person in charge of the vehicle or cargo has been arrested
16	under circumstances that require his or her immediate removal from control of
17	a vehicle; or
18	(4) in accordance with section 2152 (authorized removal of abandoned
19	motor vehicles) of this title.
20	(b)(1) An enforcement officer, without process, may seize cause removal of
21	a motor vehicle, snowmobile, motorboat, or all-terrain vehicle:

1	(A) found by him or her on which the manufacturer's serial or motor
2	number or any of the identifying numbers placed on the motor vehicle,
3	snowmobile, motorboat, or all terrain vehicle it by the manufacturer of the
4	motor vehicle, snowmobile, motorboat, or all-terrain vehicle or any of the parts
5	thereof have been obliterated, defaced, or tampered with; or
6	(B) when in his or her judgment the motor vehicle, snowmobile,
7	motorboat, or all-terrain vehicle based on reliable information it has been
8	stolen, and or taken without the consent of the owner.
9	(2) The officer may retain possession of the motor vehicle, snowmobile,
10	motorboat, or all-terrain vehicle until the Commissioner or State's Attorney of
11	the county where the vehicle, snowmobile, motorboat, or all terrain vehicle it
12	is found is satisfied as to the its rightful ownership thereof.
13	(3) Immediately on the seizure removal of the motor vehicle,
14	snowmobile, motorboat, or all-terrain vehicle, the officer shall report the same,
15	together with all the facts obtainable by him or her, to the Department of Motor
16	Vehicles in accordance with subsection (c) of this section and to the
17	Commissioner, and the officer shall notify the State's Attorney of the county in
18	which the motor vehicle, snowmobile, motorboat, or all terrain vehicle it was
19	seized removed and cause the its ownership of the motor vehicle, snowmobile,
20	motorboat, or all-terrain vehicle to be investigated.

1	(c) Unless removed to a location within sight of the original location, an
2	enforcement officer causing removal of a motor vehicle, snowmobile,
3	motorboat, all-terrain vehicle, or cargo under this section shall notify the
4	Department of Motor Vehicles as to the location and date of its discovery, date
5	of removal, name of any towing service used, and place of storage. If possible,
6	the officer shall remove and record any information which might aid in
7	ascertaining the ownership of the vehicle and forward it to the Department of
8	Motor Vehicles.
9	(d) A motor vehicle removed under authority of this section may qualify as
10	an abandoned motor vehicle under chapter 21, subchapter 7 of this title.
11	(e) Except for intentionally inflicted damage or gross negligence, a person
12	who, acting at the direction of an enforcement officer, removes from a
13	highway a motor vehicle or cargo obstructing traffic or maintenance activities
14	or creating a hazard to traffic shall not be liable for damage incurred during the
15	removal.
