6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to decrease State
7	reimbursement of special education expenditures incurred by supervisory
8	unions and school districts and increase certain of the weighting factors used to
9	calculate the weighted long-term membership of school districts. The
10	weighting factors that would be increased are for secondary students, students
11	from economically deprived backgrounds, and students for whom English is
12	not the primary language.

15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

17	Sec. 1. 16 V.S.A. § 2941 is amended to read:
18	§ 2941. POLICY AND PURPOSE
19	It is the policy of the State to ensure equal educational opportunities for all
20	children in Vermont. This means that children with disabilities are entitled to

receive a free appropriate public education. It is further the policy of the State to pay 60 percent of the statewide costs expended by public education for children with disabilities. The purpose of this chapter is to enable the Agency to ensure the provision of the special educational facilities and instruction necessary to meet the needs of children with disabilities.

- 7 § 2969. PAYMENTS

(a) On or before August 15, December 15, and April 15 of each school year, the State Treasurer shall withdraw from the Education Fund, based on warrant of the Commissioner of Finance and Management, and shall forward to each supervisory union and its member districts to the extent they anticipate reimbursable expenditures under this chapter, the amount of State assistance estimated in accordance with State Board rules to be necessary to fund sections 2961 through 2963a section 2962 of this title in the current fiscal period. The State Board shall by rule ensure that the amount of such assistance shall be adjusted to compensate for any overpayments or underpayments determined, after review and acceptance of the reports submitted under section 2968 of this title, to have been made in previous periods. Notwithstanding this subsection, failure to submit the reports within the timelines time lines established by subsection 2968(a) of this title shall result in the withholding of any payments until the report is filed.

5	(a) The Secretary may use up to two percent of the funds appropriated for
6	special education expenditures, as that term is defined in subsection 2967(b) of
7	this title (b) of this section, to directly assist supervisory unions with special
8	education expenditures of an unusual or unexpected nature. These funds shall
9	not be used for exceptional circumstances that are funded under section 2963a
10	of this title. The Secretary's decision regarding a supervisory union's
11	eligibility for and amount of assistance shall be final.
12	(b) Special education expenditures shall include:
13	(1) costs eligible for reimbursement under section 2962 of this title;
14	(2) costs for services for persons with visual impairments and persons

9	§ 4010. DETERMINATION OF WEIGHTED MEMBERSHIP
10	(a) On or before the first day of December during each school year, the
11	Secretary shall determine the average daily membership of each school district
12	for the current school year. The determination shall list separately:
13	(1) resident prekindergarten children;
14	(2) resident students being provided elementary or kindergarten
15	education; and
16	(3) resident students being provided secondary education.
17	(b) The Secretary shall determine the long-term membership for each
18	school district for each student group described in subsection (a) of this
19	section. The Secretary shall use the actual average daily membership over two
20	consecutive years, the latter of which is the current school year.

1	(c) The Secretary shall determine the weighted long-term membership for
2	each school district using the long-term membership from subsection (b) of
3	this section and the following weights for each class:
4	Prekindergarten 0.46
5	Elementary or kindergarten 1.0

7	(d) The weighted long-term membership calculated under subsection (c) of

10	backgrounds. The adjustment shall be equal to the total from subsection (c) of
11	this section, multiplied by $\frac{25}{50}$ percent, and further multiplied by the poverty
12	ratio of the district.

14	this section shall be further increased by $0.2 \pm 0.4$ for each student in average
