7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to authorize the
8	Commissioner of Motor Vehicles to issue a permit for the use of one blue light
9	on a fire department or EMS vehicle, provided the light is mounted so as to be
10	visible primarily from the rear of the vehicle.
11 12	An act relating to the use of colored lights on fire department and emergency service vehicles
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 1252 is amended to read:
15	§ 1252. ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR SIRENS OR COLORED LAMPS,
16	OR BOTH; USE OF AMBER LAMPS
17	(a) When satisfied as to the condition and use of the vehicle, the
18	Commissioner shall issue and may revoke, for cause, permits for sirens or
19	colored signal lamps in the following manner:

(1)(A) Sirens or blue or blue and white signal lamps, or a combination of these, may be authorized for all law enforcement vehicles owned or leased by a law enforcement agency, a certified law enforcement officer, or the Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council. If the applicant is a constable, the application shall be accompanied by a certification by the town clerk that the applicant is the duly elected or appointed constable and attesting that the town has not voted to limit the constable's authority to engage in enforcement activities under 24 V.S.A. § 1936a.

- (B) One blue signal lamp may be authorized for use on a vehicle owned or leased by a fire department or on an emergency medical service (EMS) vehicle, provided that the Commissioner shall require the lamp to be mounted so as to be visible primarily from the rear of the vehicle.
- (2) Sirens and red or red and white signal lamps may be authorized for all ambulances and other EMS vehicles, fire apparatus department vehicles, vehicles used solely in rescue operations, or vehicles owned or leased by, or provided to, volunteer firefighters and voluntary rescue squad members, including a vehicle owned by a volunteer's employer when the volunteer has the written authorization of the employer to use the vehicle for emergency fire or rescue activities.

1	(3) No vehicle may be authorized a permit for more than one of the
2	combinations described in subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection.
3	[Repealed.]
4	(4) No motor vehicle, other than one owned by the applicant, shall be
5	issued a permit until the Commissioner has recorded the information regarding
6	both the owner of the vehicle and the applicant for the permit.
7	(5) Upon application to the Commissioner, the Commissioner may issue
8	a single permit for all the vehicles owned or leased by the applicant.
9	(6) Sirens and red or red and white signal lamps, or sirens and blue or
10	blue and white signal lamps, may be authorized for restored emergency or
11	enforcement vehicles used for exhibition purposes. Sirens and lamps
12	authorized under this subdivision may only be activated during an exhibition,
13	such as a car show or parade.

17	(1)(a) The provisions of section 1251 of this title shall not apply to
18	directional signal lamps of a type approved by the Commissioner of Motor
19	Vehicles.
20	(2)(b) All persons with motor vehicles equipped as provided in subdivision
21	subdivisions 1252(a)(1) and (2) of this title, shall use the sirens or colored

1	signal lamps, or both, only in the direct performance of their official duties.
2	When any person other than a law enforcement officer, firefighter, or
3	emergency medical service (EMS) responder is operating a motor vehicle
4	equipped as provided in subdivision 1252(a)(1) of this title, the colored signal
5	lamp shall be either removed, covered, or hooded. When any person, other
6	than an authorized ambulance EMS vehicle operator, firefighter, or authorized
7	operator of vehicles used in <u>a</u> rescue operation, is operating a motor vehicle
8	equipped as provided in subdivision 1252(a)(2) of this title, the colored signal
9	lamps shall be either removed, covered, or hooded unless the operator holds a
10	senior operator license.
