10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. 21 V.S.A. § 384 is amended to read:
12	§ 384. EMPLOYMENT; WAGES
13	(a)(1) An employer shall not employ any employee at a rate of less than
14	\$9.15. Beginning on January 1, 2016, an employer shall not employ any
15	employee at a rate of less than \$9.60. Beginning on January 1, 2017, an
16	employer shall not employ any employee at a rate of less than:
17	<u>(A)</u> \$10.00.
18	(B) Beginning on January 1, 2018, an employer shall not employ any
19	employee at a rate of less than \$10.50, and.
20	(C) beginning Beginning on January 1, 2019 and, \$11.50.

1	(D) Beginning on January 1, 2020, \$12.50.
2	(E) Beginning on January 1, 2021, \$13.50.
3	(F) Beginning on January 1, 2022, \$15.00.
4	(G) on On each subsequent January 1, the prior minimum wage rate
5	shall be increased by five percent or the percentage increase of the Consumer
6	Price Index, CPI-U, U.S. city average, not seasonally adjusted, or successor
7	index, as calculated by the U.S. Department of Labor or successor agency for
8	the 12 months preceding the previous September 1, whichever is smaller, but
9	in. In no event shall the minimum wage be decreased. The minimum wage
10	shall be rounded off to the nearest \$0.01.
11	(2)(A) An employer in the hotel, motel, tourist place, and restaurant
12	industry shall not employ a service or tipped employee at a basic wage rate of
13	less than one-half the minimum wage:
14	<u>(i) \$5.00;</u>
15	(ii) beginning on January 1, 2019, \$7.50;
16	(iii) beginning on January 1, 2020, \$10.00;
17	(iv) beginning on January 1, 2021, \$12.50; and
18	(v) beginning on January 1, 2022, the minimum wage established
19	pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection.
20	(B) As used in this subsection subdivision, "a service or tipped
21	employee" means an employee of a hotel, motel, tourist place, or restaurant

1	who customarily and regularly receives more than \$120.00 per month in tips
2	for direct and personal customer service.
3	(3) If the minimum wage rate established by the U.S. government is
4	greater than the rate established for Vermont pursuant to either subdivision (1)
5	or (2) of this subsection for any year, the minimum wage rate for that year
6	pursuant to that subdivision shall be the rate established by the U.S.
7	government.
