18	(1) basic communication skills, including reading, writing, and the use
19	of numbers;

1	(2) citizenship, history, and government in of Vermont and the United

3	(3) physical education and comprehensive health education, including
4	the effects of tobacco, alcoholic drinks, and drugs on the human system and on

6	(4) English, American, and other literature;

8	(6) the fine arts;
