7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to limit the use
8	of physical restraints on a child in custody to situations when the child is
9	uncontrollable and presents a danger to him or herself or others.
10	An act relating to the use of physical restraints on a juvenile in custody
11	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
12	Sec. 1. 33 V.S.A. § 5123 is amended to read:
13	§ 5123. TRANSPORTATION OF A CHILD; USE OF PHYSICAL
14	<u>RESTRAINTS</u>
15	(a) <u>Transportation of a child.</u>
16	(1) The Commissioner for Children and Families shall ensure that all
17	reasonable and appropriate measures consistent with public safety are made to
18	transport or escort a child subject to this chapter in a manner that:
19	(1)(A) reasonably avoids physical and psychological trauma;
20	(2)(B) respects the privacy of the child; and

1	(3)(C) represents the least restrictive means necessary for the safety of
2	the child.
3	(b)(2) The Commissioner for Children and Families shall have the
4	authority to select the person or persons who may transport a child under the
5	Commissioner's care and custody.
6	(e)(3) The Commissioner shall ensure supervisory review of every decision
7	to transport a child using mechanical restraints. When transportation with
8	restraints for a particular child is approved, the reasons for the approval shall
9	be documented in writing.
10	(d) It is the policy of the State of Vermont that mechanical restraints are not
11	routinely used on children subject to this chapter unless circumstances dictate
12	that such methods are necessary.
13	(b) Physical restraints.
14	(1) The use of physical restraints on a child is prohibited except to
15	prevent physical harm to the child or another person. This exemption shall
16	exist only if:
17	(A) the use of restraints is necessary to prevent physical harm to the
18	child or another person; and
19	(B) no less restrictive alternatives exist that will prevent flight or
20	physical harm to the child or another person.

1	(2) Permissible physical restraints, consisting solely of soft restraints,
2	shall be used only as provided in subdivision (1) of this subsection. The
3	restraints shall be removed as soon as the child is controllable. Use of physical
4	restraints shall be prohibited beyond one-half hour unless a child is being
5	transported by vehicle and physical restraint is necessary for public safety. If
6	restraints are placed on a child's hands and feet, the hand and foot restraints are
7	not to be joined. When in restraints, a child may not be attached to any
8	furniture or fixture in a room or object in a vehicle, except that the child may
9	be restrained by a seatbelt.
10	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
11	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
