6	(a)(1) For the purpose of collective bargaining, the representatives of the
7	municipal employer and the bargaining unit shall meet at any reasonable time
8	and shall bargain in good faith with respect to wages, hours, and conditions of
9	employment, and shall execute a written contract incorporating any agreement
10	reached; provided, however, neither party shall be compelled to agree to a
11	proposal nor to make a concession, nor to bargain over any issue of managerial
12	prerogative.
13	(2) For municipal employees who are employed by a school district,
14	supervisory district, or supervisory union, to the extent that the contract relates
