1	(10) "CTE tuition" means the amount calculated by subtracting from
2	total regional technical CTE center costs all expenditures from State and
3	federal grants except for incentive grants, adult education grants, or other State
4	grants as defined by State Board rule, then dividing the result by the sum of the
5	actual number of full-time equivalent out-of-state students and the average of
6	the full-time equivalent Vermont students for the three prior years based on
7	October 15 student counts.

11	(a) The State Board has overall responsibility for the effectiveness of career
12	technical education. This requires the Board to collect suitable information
13	and to take appropriate steps within its legal, financial, and personnel resources
14	to ensure that:
15	(1) Career technical education is equally available to students and is of
16	consistent quality in all parts of the State, including areas remote from career
17	technical centers. Career technical education programming shall be available
18	to students in grades 10 through 12. Pretechnical studies programming shall be
19	available to students in grades 9 and 10.

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1 (b) Assistance under this section shall be determined by a formula and 2 standards established by rule of the State Board. The formula and those 3 standards: (1) Shall provide different levels of support for different positions as 4 5 follows: (A) Directors and guidance coordinators' salary assistance Salary 6 7 assistance for directors, assistant directors, guidance coordinators, and career 8 pathways coordinators shall be 50 percent of the State average salary and 9 benefits for each position, or 50 percent of the actual salary and benefits for 10 each individual, whichever is less. 11 (B) Assistant directors, except for assistant directors for adult 12 education, if the district is eligible, and co-op teachers' salary assistance shall 13 be 35 percent of the State average salary and benefits for each position, or 35 14 percent of the actual salary and benefits for each individual, whichever is less. 15 (C) Salary assistance for assistant directors for adult education shall 16 be up to 50 percent of the State average salary and benefits paid to full-time 17 assistant directors for adult education; salary assistance shall be prorated for 18 part-time assistant directors. State General Fund assistance shall 21 be divided so that each district employing an assistant director receives the

11	Sec. 5. CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION STUDY
12	COMMITTEE
13	(a) Creation. There is created the Career Technical Education Study
14	Committee.
15	(b) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of the following nine
16	members:
17	(1) the Secretary of Education or designee;
18	(2) the Secretary of Human Services or designee;
19	(3) the Commissioner of Labor or designee;
20	(4) the Commissioner of Commerce and Community Development or
21	designee;

1	(5) the Chancellor of the Vermont State Colleges or designee; and	
2	(6) four directors of career technical centers, two directors from centers	
3	operated by supervisory unions, one from a private school providing technical	
4	education, and one from an independent technical center school district chosen	
5	by the Vermont Association of Career and Technical Education Directors.	
6	(c) Powers and duties. The Committee shall study:	
7	(1) funding systems for career technical education, including flexibility	
8	for career technical education centers serving out-of-state students;	
9	(2) how to improve career technical education students' preparation for	
10	postsecondary education and careers;	
11	(3) how to enhance industry and workforce training opportunities;	
12	(4) how school district consolidation affects the service regions of career	
13	technical education centers;	
14	(5) how to enhance career pathways supports in priority sectors for

8	(1) The Secretary of Education shall call the first meeting of the
9	Committee to occur on or before August 1, 2017.

14	(g) Reimbursement. Members of the Committee who are not employees of
