7	Subject: Education; education finance; statewide education property tax rates
8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to make several
9	changes to the current statewide education property tax. First, the bill removes
10	the excess spending penalty and income sensitivity adjustments, starting in
11	fiscal year 2018. Second, it creates a new system for calculating spending-
12	adjusted tax rates. It does so by calculating how much money there is in the
13	Education Fund for a statewide base tax rate of 1.00, and it divides that number
14	by the number of students in the State. It then allows districts to raise more
15	than that base amount on an equalized basis. Tax rates calculated for districts
16	that raise more than the base amount would be based on the income of each
17	taxpayer in the district, and based on a single income yield. Districts that spent
18	less than the base amount would still receive a tax rate required to raise the
19	base amount.
