6	Subject: General provisions; State flags; Green Mountain Boys Flag; State

8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to direct that the
9	Green Mountain Boys Flag shall be flown on the 15th day of January each
10	year under the U.S. Flag at the State House in Montpelier in observance of
11	Vermont's independence.
12	An act relating to flying the Green Mountain Boys Flag at the State House
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS
15	On January 15, 1777, delegates from 28 towns that supported the military
16	and political leadership of Ethan Allen and the Green Mountain Boys
17	convened in the town of Westminster and declared the independence of the
18	territory, known as the New Hampshire Grants, from the British colony of
19	Quebec and the American states of New Hampshire and New York, adopting

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1	the name New Connecticut (Vermont). The flying of the Green Mountain
2	Boys Flag at the State House in Montpelier, on the 15th day of January each
3	year, would commemorate this important event in the history of Vermont.
4	Sec. 2. 1 V.S.A. § 496 is amended to read:
5	§ 496. STATE FLAGS, PURCHASE, DISTRIBUTION
6	(a) The Secretary of State shall obtain, through the Department of
7	Buildings and General Services, obtain State Flags and a copy of the
8	Bennington Battle Flag, so-called. He or she The Secretary may, in his or her
9	discretion and on such terms as that he or she finds appropriate, distribute said
10	these State Flags to other states; to State officials, departments, and agencies;
11	and to such other persons as he or she the Secretary may determine should
12	have receive them in the interest of the State. He or she shall cause the
13	Bennington Battle Flag to be delivered to the custody of the Sergeant at Arms
14	to be flown at the State House in Montpelier, under the United States Flag, on
15	the 15th, 16th, and 17th days of August in each year to commemorate the
16	Battle of Bennington.
17	(b) The Secretary of State shall furnish to the Division for Historic
18	Preservation, under this section, one Vermont State Flag and one Bennington
19	Battle Flag to be flown at the Bennington Battle Monument Area.
20	Sec. 3. 1 V.S.A. § 496a is added to read:
21	§ 496a. BENNINGTON BATTLE FLAG

1	The Secretary of State shall obtain, through the Department of Buildings
2	and General Services, two copies of the Bennington Battle Flag, one for
3	delivery to the Sergeant at Arms to be flown at the State House in Montpelier,
4	under the U.S. Flag, on the 15th, 16th, and 17th days of August each year to
5	commemorate the Battle of Bennington, and a second for delivery to the
6	Vermont Division for Historic Preservation, along with one Vermont State
7	Flag, to be flown at the Bennington Battle Monument Area.
8	Sec. 4. 1 V.S.A. § 496b is added to read:
9	§ 496b. GREEN MOUNTAIN BOYS FLAG
10	The Secretary of State shall obtain, through the Department of Buildings
11	and General Services, a copy of the Green Mountain Boys Flag for delivery to
12	the Sergeant at Arms to be flown at the State House in Montpelier, under the
13	U.S. Flag, on the 15th day of January each year to commemorate Vermont's
14	independence.
15	Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE
16	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
