7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require
8	commercial health insurers to share costs associated with the provision of
9	medication-assisted treatment by certain providers.
10 11	An act relating to coverage for costs associated with medication-assisted treatment by commercial health insurers
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 4754 is added to read:
14	§ 4754. HEALTH INSURER PARTICIPATION
15	(a) A health insurer shall make a monthly payment to physicians and
16	advanced practice registered nurses who are not affiliated with an authorized
17	treatment program but who meet federal requirements for use of controlled
18	substances in the pharmacological treatment of opioid addiction in order to
19	contribute to the shared costs of funding the licensed alcohol and drug
20	counselors and other medical professionals who support this work. These

1	contributions shall be required as a condition of the insurer doing business in
2	the State. The amount of each insurer's contribution to each participating
3	physician or advanced practice registered nurse shall be determined by the
4	Commissioner of Vermont Health Access and shall be based on the number of
5	the insurer's enrollees receiving pharmacological treatment from the physician
6	or advanced practice registered nurse.
7	(b) As used in this section, "health insurer" means any health insurance
8	company, nonprofit hospital and medical service corporation, managed care
9	organizations, and, to the extent permitted under federal law, any administrator
10	of an insured, self-insured, or publicly funded health care benefit plan offered
11	by public and private entities. The term shall include the administrator of the
12	health benefit plan offered by the State of Vermont to its employees and the
13	administrator of any health benefit plan offered by any agency or
14	instrumentality of the State to its employees. The term shall not include stand-
15	alone dental plans or benefit plans providing coverage for specific diseases or
16	other limited benefit coverage.
