9	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require that
10	amusement rides be inspected for safety.
11	An act relating to the inspection of amusement rides
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. FINDINGS
14	The General Assembly finds that:
15	(1) Fairs are essential to the character, community life, and economy of
16	Vermont, and amusement rides help to increase fair attendance.
17	(2) The public assumes that rides have been inspected by certified
18	inspectors and are therefore safe.

1	(3) Although many rides are inspected by the ride operators or other
2	parties, Vermont is one of the few states that do not currently have a
3	mandatory amusement ride inspection program.
4	(4) Establishing such a program will help ensure that amusement rides
5	continue to be safe and that Vermonters and visitors continue to patronize fairs.
6	Sec. 2. 31 V.S.A. § 722 is amended to read:
7	§ 722. CERTIFICATE OF OPERATION
8	(a) An amusement ride may not be operated in this State unless the
9	Secretary of State Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets has issued a
10	certificate of operation to the owner or operator.
11	(b) The Secretary of State Agency shall issue a "certificate of operation" no
12	not later than 15 days before the amusement ride is first operated in the State,
13	if the owner or operator submits all the following:
14	(1) Certificate a certificate of insurance in the amount of not less than
15	\$1,000,000.00 that insures both the owner and the operator against liability for
16	injury to persons and property arising out of the use or operation of the
17	amusement ride-:
18	(2) Payment payment of a fee in the amount of \$100.00; and
19	(3) a record of the most recent safety inspection.
20	(c) The certificate of operation shall be valid for one year from the date of
21	issue.

1	(d) A copy of the certificate of operation shall be posted on or near each
2	amusement ride covered by the certificate or at the office of the amusement
3	ride operator and shall be in full public view at all times during the operation
4	of the ride.
5	Sec. 3. 31 V.S.A. § 723a is added to read:
6	§ 723a. SAFETY INSPECTIONS
7	(a) An amusement ride shall not be operated in this State unless the ride has
8	had a safety inspection as follows:
9	(1) A ride at a fixed location shall be inspected on an annual basis.
10	(2) A ride that is moved from location to location shall be inspected
11	after the ride has been set up but before being used to carry or convey
12	passengers.
13	(b) An amusement ride shall be inspected by a person certified by the
14	National Association of Amusement Ride Safety Officials as a Level III
15	Inspector.
16	(c) The operator of an amusement ride shall:
17	(1) keep records of all safety inspections in a manner and format to be
18	prescribed by the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets;
19	(2) make those records available to the Agency promptly upon
20	request; and

1	(3) post in full public view during the operation of the ride a copy or
2	record of the most recent safety inspection of each ride on or near that ride or
3	at the office of the amusement ride operator.
4	(d) The Agency shall:
5	(1) prescribe the manner and format of inspection records; and
6	(2) maintain a list of all persons certified by the National Association of
7	Amusement Ride Safety Officials as a Level III Inspector available to conduct
8	inspections of amusement rides in Vermont and make that list easily available
9	to amusement ride operators and owners.
10	Sec. 4. 31 V.S.A. § 724 is amended to read:
11	§ 724. PENALTY; ENFORCEMENT
12	(a) If, at any time, the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets
13	determines that an amusement ride operator is in violation of this chapter, the
14	Agency may order the operator to cease operating any amusement ride in this
15	State until the operator is in compliance with this chapter. The Agency shall
16	post in full public view an order to cease operation on all affected amusement
17	rides.
18	(b) An operator or owner or any person who violates any provision of this
19	chapter shall be fined no not more than \$500.00 \$1,000.00 per day for each day
20	the violation continues.
