13	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require public

17	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
18	Sec. 1. GOALS
19	In order to ensure that Vermont public school students who are awarded a
20	high school diploma have a basic understanding of U.S. civics and history and

1	to promote and encourage active and engaged citizenship, Vermont students
2	shall pass, as a condition of being awarded a high school diploma, the basic
3	civics test produced by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services and
4	administered to all applicants for U.S. citizenship.

6	<u>§ 914. HIGH SCHOOL CIVICS TEST REQUIREMENT</u>
7	(a) Vermont students shall, as a condition of being awarded a high school
8	diploma, take and receive a passing grade on the U.S. citizenship civics test,
9	produced by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services and administered
10	to all applicants for U.S. citizenship, subject to the following terms and
11	conditions:
12	(1) students shall be tested on all questions on the civics test, with a
13	minimum score of 60 percent required for passage; and
14	(2) students may take the civics test as many times as may be necessary
15	for passage.
16	(b) This section applies to all students who are awarded a high school
17	diploma who attend a State public school or career technical center, but shall
18	not apply to students who are in special education programs.
19	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
20	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2018 and shall apply to high school
21	students who graduate in or after the 2020 academic year.
