11	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
12	Sec. 1. CHARTER AMENDMENT APPROVAL
13	The General Assembly approves the amendments to the charter of the City
14	of Barre as set forth in this act. Voters approved the proposal of amendments
15	on March 6, 2018.

11	§ 605. LOCAL ROOMS, MEALS, AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES		
12	OPTION TAXES		
13	Local option taxes are authorized under this section for the purpose of		
14	affording the City an alternative method of raising municipal revenues.		
15	Accordingly:		
16	(a) The City Council may assess rooms, meals, and alcohol taxes of one		
17	percent.		
	(b) Any tax imposed under the authority of this section shall be		
	collected and administered by the Department of Taxes, in accordance with		
	State law governing such State tax 24 V.S.A. § 138.		
18	(c) Of the taxes reported under this section. 70 percent shall be paid to		

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1	the City for calendar years thereafter. Such revenues may be expended by the
2	City for mumcipal services only and not for education expenditures. The
3	remaining amount of taxes reported shall be remitted monthly to the State
4	Treasurer for deposit into the PILOT Special Fund set forth in 32 V.S.A.
5	§ 3709. Taxes due to the City under this section shall be paid by the State on a
6	quarterly basis.
7	(dc) Revenues received through a tax imposed under this section shall
8	be designated solely for street and sidewalk reconstruction.
9	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
10	This act shall take effect on passage.
