5 Subject: General provisions; legal holidays; Columbus Day

6 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to change the
7 name of the legal holiday from Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day.

8 An act relating to Indigenous Peoples' Day

9 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

10 Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS

11 The General Assembly of the State of Vermont finds:

12 (1) Indigenous Peoples' Day was originally proposed in 1977 by a
13 delegation of Native Nations to the International Conference on Discrimination
14 Against Indigenous Populations in the Americas.

15 (2) Many cities and towns in the United States have recognized
16 Columbus Day as "Indigenous Peoples' Day," to highlight, celebrate, and
17 educate others about indigenous heritage and resiliency.

18 (3) The General Assembly recognizes and values the historic, cultural,
19 and contemporary significance of the Indigenous peoples of the lands that later
20 became known as the Americas, which includes Vermont.

1 (4) Vermont was founded and built upon lands first inhabited by the
2 Abenaki people, their ancestors and allies, and honors these members of the
3 public, both past and present.

4 (5) The establishment of this holiday will aid in the cultural
5 development of Vermont's recognized tribes, while enabling all Indigenous
6 peoples in Vermont and elsewhere to move forward from, and formulate
7 positive outcomes from, historical, administered colonization.

9 § 371. LEGAL HOLIDAYS

10 (a) The following shall be legal holidays:

11 (1) New Year's Day, January 1;

12 (2) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Birthday, the third Monday in January;

13 (3) Lincoln's Birthday, February 12;

14 (4) Washington's Birthday, the third Monday in February;

15 (5) Town Meeting Day, the first Tuesday in March;

16 (6) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;

17 (7) Independence Day, July 4;

18 (8) Bennington Battle Day, August 16;

19 (9) Labor Day, the first Monday in September;

20 (10) Columbus Indigenous Peoples' Day, the second Monday in

21 October;
