S. 224.

Bills Referred to Committee on Appropriations

S. 49. An act relating to jurors' compensation.

S. 244. An act relating to repealing the guidelines for spousal maintenance awards.

An act relating to eliminating fees for placing or removing a credit freeze.

Message from the House No. 7

Mr. President:

I am directed to inform the Senate that:

The House has passed House bills of the following titles:

H. 300. An act relating to the statute of limitations for recovery and possession of property actions against the grantee of a tax collector's deed.

H. 551. An act relating to flying the Green Mountain Boys Flag at the State House.

H. 563. An act relating to repealing the crimes of vagrancy.

In the passage of which the concurrence of the Senate is requested.

The House has considered a bill originating in the Senate of the following title:

S. 149. An act relating to the authority of the Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation to enter into land transactions.

And has passed the same in concurrence.

The House has considered joint resolution originating in the Senate of the following title:

J.R.S. 42. Joint resolution relating to weekend adjournment.

And has adopted the same in concurrence.
