House concurrent resolution thanking David and June Keenan of Essex for their generous donation to the State House art collection of a Keith Rocco print depicting the Battle of Cedar Creek

Offered by: Representatives Dunn of Essex, Bancroft of Westford, Giambatista of Essex, Houghton of Essex, Myers of Essex, and Devereux of Mount Holly

<u>Whereas</u>, the Battle of Cedar Creek, in Virginia, was a critical Civil War battle in October 1864 that secured the strategic Shenandoah Valley for the Union, ending any further Confederate threat on Washington, D.C., and

<u>Whereas</u>, the Eighth Vermont, Tenth Vermont, and First Vermont Cavalry all played key roles in the Battle of Cedar Creek, and the Eighth Vermont sustained a loss of two-thirds of its men in a surprise Confederate attack that was often fought hand-to-hand in fog-enshrouded conditions, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the Civil War Trust is "a nonprofit organization devoted to the preservation of America's hallowed battlegrounds" primarily related to the Civil War, and

<u>Whereas</u>, in 2017, the Civil War Trust is conducting a fundraising campaign to save four Civil War battlefields, including land associated with the Battle of Cedar Creek, and

<u>Whereas</u>, artist Keith Rocco recently painted, for the National Park Service's Cedar Creek Battlefield Park, a colorful piece entitled *"Rally on the Battery!"*(Middletown Cemetery—The Battle of Cedar Creek) that is on display at Mt. Carmel Cemetery, the modern name for Middletown Cemetery, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the Civil War Trust is offering a limited edition print of this painting to major contributors to the campaign, and

<u>Whereas</u>, two of these major donors were David and June Keenan of Essex who are devotees of Civil War history and especially Vermont's role in the war, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the Keenans have donated their copy of this colorful print to the State House art collection where it will complement the 19th century Civil War paintings of Julian Scott, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the Keenans' gift represents a generous and most welcomed donation to the State House's artistic portfolio, now therefore be it
