COMMUNICATION SCIENCES & DISORDERS

As part of CSD 327, School based issues for the Speech-Language Pathologist, the students take the online Mandated Reporter training developed by the state of Vermont. As part of the training, they discuss different types of abuse.

Second year graduate students in speech-language pathology receive a 1.5 hour guest lecture in CSD 324 Student Clinic seminar about trauma-informed care from a child psychiatrist and a speech-language pathologist who serve the clinic in the Vermont Center for Children, Youth and Families.
