1	TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
2	The Committee on Agriculture and Forestry to which was referred Senate
3	Bill No. 33 entitled "An act relating to the Rozo McLaughlin Farm-to-School
4	Program" respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends
5	that the House propose to the Senate that the bill be amended as follows:
6	First: In Sec. 1, in 6 V.S.A. § 4719, in subdivision (a)(5), after "Vermont
7	students in" and before "programs" by striking out the words "school meal"
8	and inserting in lieu thereof the words "child nutrition"
9	Second: In Sec. 1, by striking out 6 V.S.A. § 4721 in its entirety and
10	inserting in lieu thereof the following:
11	§ 4721. LOCAL FOODS GRANT PROGRAM
12	(a) There is created in the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets the
13	Rozo McLaughlin Farm-to-School Program to execute, administer, and award
14	local grants for the purpose of helping Vermont schools develop
15	farm-to-school programs that will sustain relationships with local farmers and
16	producers, enrich the educational experience of students, improve the health of
17	Vermont children, and enhance Vermont's agricultural economy.
18	(b) A school, a school district, a consortium of schools, or a consortium of
19	school districts, or registered or licensed child care providers may apply to the
20	Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets for a grant award to:

1	(1) fund equipment, resources, training, and materials that will help to
2	increase use of local foods in the School Food Service Program child nutrition
3	programs;
4	(2) fund items, including local farm food products, gardening supplies,
5	field trips to farms, gleaning on farms, and stipends to visiting farmers, that
6	will help teachers educators to use hands-on educational techniques to teach
7	children about nutrition and farm-to-school connections; and
8	(3) provide fund professional development and technical assistance, in
9	partnership with the Agency of Education and farm-to-school technical service
10	providers, to help teachers, child nutrition personnel, and members of the farm-
11	to-school community educate students about nutrition and farm-to-school
12	connections and assist schools and licensed or registered childcare providers in
13	developing a farm-to-school program.
14	(4) fund technical assistance or support strategies to increase
15	participation in federal child nutrition programs that increase the viability of
16	sustainable meal programs.
17	(c) The Secretaries of Agriculture, Food and Markets and of Education and
18	the Commissioner of Health, in consultation with farmers, food service
19	workers child nutrition staff, and educators, and farm-to-school technical
20	service providers jointly shall jointly adopt rules procedures relating to the
21	content of the grant application and the criteria for making awards.

1	(d) The Secretary shall determine that there is significant interest in the
2	school community before making an award and shall give priority
3	consideration to schools and, school districts and, registered or licensed child
4	care providers that are developing farm-to-school connections and education
5	that indicate a willingness to make changes to their child nutrition programs to
6	increase student access and participation and that are making progress toward
7	the implementation of the Vermont nutrition and fitness policy guidelines
8	School Wellness Policy Guidelines developed by the Agency of Agriculture,
9	Food and Markets, the Agency of Education, and the Department of Health,
10	dated November 2005 updated in June 2015 or of the successor of these
11	guidelines.
12	(e) No award shall be greater than \$15,000.00.
