Sec. xx. THINKVERMONT MOVE INITIATIVE

- (a) The ThinkVermont MOVE Initiative is created as a mechanism to be responsive to the growth needs of Vermont's workforce. This initiative, a portion of the larger interagency workforce development plan, is designed to attract and retain workers and families, and increase the number and skill level of available workers statewide.
- (b) In fiscal year 2019, the amount of \$2.5M is appropriated from the General Fund to the Agency of Commerce and Community Development to implement the ThinkVermont MOVE Initiative pursuant to this section.
- (c) The Secretary of Commerce and Community Development shall direct the investments as follows:
 - (1) \$1.25M to strategies that enhance the Vermont brand; illuminate the vibrancy of our communities businesses, and other assets; and identify, recruit, and provide relocation assistance to workers including:
 - A. \$900,000 for identification of target audiences, digital and social media targeting; execution of the State's core Economic Development Marketing Plan, paid and earned media, and technology, data, and analysis tools; strategies that convert visitors to residents, and;
 - B. \$350,000 for relocation services to support sector-specific recruitment and relocation initiatives.
 - (2) \$1.25M to incentive that assist those relocating to Vermont including:

- A. \$750,000 for a down payment assistance program to make \$5,000 grants to

 families purchasing their first Vermont home to be administered by the Vermont

 Housing Finance Agency, and;
- B. \$250,000 in relocation incentives for out-of-state workers and families to relocate to Vermont. These \$500 reimbursements for those moving to Vermont to work will be paid upon filing a new resident Vermont income tax return.
 Reimbursements will be tracked through a mechanism created by the Agency of Commerce & Community Development and Department of Taxes.
- C. \$250,000 in referral bonuses for Vermonters who refer out-of-state people who become full-time residents via a new online recruitment portal developed pursuant to this statute. Once a new resident demonstrates residency and earned income by filing a new Vermont income tax return a proof of referral form will be used by the new tax filer to certify the Vermonter who made their referral to receive a \$500 referral bonus. These bonuses will be tracked through a mechanism created by the Agency of Commerce & Community Development and Department of Taxes.
