8	that are part of a prekindergarten region to form a prekindergarten
9	collaborative with prequalified providers located within the prekindergarten
10	region to coordinate the delivery of prekindergarten services throughout the
11	region; (3) permit a school district to pay tuition to a prequalified provider that
12	operates a prekindergarten program outside the district's academic year; and
13	(4) permit a public prequalified provider to receive additional payment directly
14	from a parent or guardian for the provision of prekindergarten services in
15	excess of publicly funded prekindergarten education that is required under

5	(d) Tuition, budgets, and average daily membership.
6	(1) On behalf of a resident prekindergarten child, a district shall pay
7	tuition for prekindergarten education for ten hours per week for 35 weeks
8	annually to a prequalified private provider or to a public school outside the
9	district that is prequalified pursuant to subsection (c) of this section; provided,
10	however, that the district shall pay tuition for weeks that are within the
11	district's academic year. Tuition paid under this section shall be at a statewide
12	rate, which may be adjusted regionally, that is established annually through a
13	process jointly developed and implemented by the Agencies of Education and
14	of Human Services. A district shall pay tuition upon:
15	(A) receiving notice from the child's parent or guardian that the child
16	is or will be admitted to the prekindergarten education program operated by the
17	prequalified private provider or the other district; and
18	(B) concurrent enrollment of the prekindergarten child in the district
19	of residence for purposes of budgeting and determining average daily
20	membership.

1	(2) In addition to any direct costs of operating a prekindergarten
2	education program, a district of residence shall include anticipated tuition
3	payments and any administrative, quality assurance, quality improvement,
4	transition planning, or other prekindergarten-related costs in its annual budget
5	presented to the voters.
6	(3) Pursuant to subdivision $4001(1)(C)$ of this title, the district of
7	residence may include within its average daily membership any
8	prekindergarten child for whom it has provided prekindergarten education or
9	on whose behalf it has paid tuition pursuant to this section.
10	(4) A prequalified private provider, whether public or private, may
11	receive additional payment directly from the parent or guardian only for
12	prekindergarten education in excess of the hours paid for by the district
13	pursuant to this section or for child care services, or both. A school district

5	may choose to limit the geographic boundaries within which the district shall
6	pay tuition by paying tuition solely to those prequalified providers in which
7	parents and guardians choose to enroll resident prekindergarten children that
8	are located within the district's or supervisory union's "prekindergarten
9	region" as determined in subdivision (2) of this subsection.
10	(2) For purposes of this subsection, upon application from the <u>district's</u>
11	or supervisory union's school board, a district's or supervisory union's
12	prekindergarten region shall be determined jointly by the Agencies of
13	Education and of Human Services in consultation with the school board,
14	private providers of prekindergarten education, parents and guardians of
15	prekindergarten children, and other interested parties pursuant to a process
16	adopted by rule under subsection (e) of this section. A prekindergarten region:
17	(A) shall not be smaller than the geographic boundaries of the school

13	(4) If a school board chooses to pay district pays tuition to providers
