Dear Marjorie Zunder,

The Act 46 war continues and will as every war's aftermath which in turn creates future wars.

We have witnessed and lived through 3 such wars in Vermont, one in 1958, another in the late 60's, and the current 46.

In each case men and women acted in an imperial manner plus Elizabethan courtesies to solve a largely financial problem

being faced by the State.

In each case persons remote from persons affected made decisions for the persons affected, and about their money.

In each case a Department of Education abandoned "education," that is, eductive methods.

After witnessing the three wars above, I

suggest the following:

- presenting to

the teachers and students of a given area, perhaps statewide, "We have a problem. We need your help."

- a "package" for

that could be, e.g., a course in :"Civics," "Getting Along," "Bullying," "Community Development," and the like, through which

the

teachers and students are invited to "solve the problem." Such courses might approach anticipated problems 10 years or more in advance, thus bringing better

tailored, composed solutions TO the State committees concerned, often well in advance of a problem, and sometimes even

anticipating

efforts that prevent the problem from occurring.
