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TESTIMONY PROVIDED TO: House Education Committee TOPIC: SLP Licensing

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This testimony was provided in large part last session to Senate Government Ops. A 4th column presenting the impact of Senator Mullin's proposal in the current Senate Miscellaneous Education Bill has been added. Please note, that all options for a single license, if not held at the AOE, result in additional transaction costs that will need to be covered. The AOE is able to support Options 2-4 with no additional revenues. Option 1, would require substantial new fees or revenue to execute.

³ OPR would need to confirm the loss here, based on their fee of \$100 per year and roughly 400 SLPS (clinical and educator) renewing each year, we estimate this at \$80,000 per year.

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⁴ For the next two years, approximately 1/4 (250) of licensees renew, and then there are new applicants. Applicants pay for their full term of their license at the time of application; some are for 3 year licenses at \$200 each and some are for 5-year licenses at \$300 each. Assuming (150 licensees *\$200)+ (100 licensees *\$300)=\$60,000. If all applicants need 3-year licenses the figure would be \$50,000; if all need 5-year licenses applicants the figure would be \$75,000.
