17	(a) For the purposes of this section, a "page" is defined as a single side of a
18	leaf of paper on which is printed, written, or otherwise placed information to
19	be recorded or filed. The maximum covered area on a page shall be $71/2$
20	inches by 14 inches. All letters shall be at least one-sixteenth inch in height or

7	providing the service or product or performing the regulatory function.
8	(2) "Fee" means any a monetary charge collected by or on behalf of a
9	town for a service or product provided to, or the regulation of, specified classes
10	of individuals or entities.
11	(3) "Town" means a town, city, incorporated village, unorganized town
12	or gore, and the unified towns and gores in Essex County.
13	(b) No later than the third Tuesday of the legislative session of 2019 and
