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The Committee on Government Operations to which was referred House
Bill No. 42 entitled "An act relating to appointing municipal clerks and
treasurers and to incompatible municipal offices" respectfully reports that it
has considered the same and recommends that the bill be amended by striking
out all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

* * * Appointing Municipal Clerks and Treasurers * * *

Sec. 1. 17 V.S.A. § 2646 is amended to read:

§ 2646. TOWN OFFICERS; QUALIFICATION; ELECTION

At the annual meeting, a town shall choose from among its registered voters the following town officers, who shall serve until the next annual meeting and until successors are chosen, unless otherwise provided by law:

13 ***

(2) A town clerk for a, unless the town has voted to authorize the selectboard to appoint the town clerk as provided in section 2651e of this chapter. The term of office for a town clerk shall be for one year, unless a town votes that a town the clerk shall be elected for a term of three years.

When a town votes for a three-year term for the office of town clerk, that three-year term shall remain in effect until the town rescinds it by the majority vote of the legal voters present and voting at an annual meeting, duly warned for that purpose.

1	(3) A town treasurer for a, unless the town has voted to authorize the
2	selectboard to appoint the treasurer as provided in section 2651f of this
3	<u>chapter. The</u> term of <u>office of a town treasurer shall be for</u> one year, unless a
4	town votes that a town treasurer shall be elected for a term of three years.
5	When a town votes for a three-year term for the office of town treasurer, that
6	three-year term shall remain in effect until the town rescinds it by the majority
7	vote of the legal voters present and voting at an annual meeting, duly warned
8	for that purpose.

12	(a) A municipality may vote at an annual meeting to authorize the
13	legislative body to appoint the municipal clerk. A municipal clerk so
14	appointed may be removed by the legislative body for just cause after notice
15	and hearing.
16	(b) A vote to authorize the legislative body to appoint the municipal clerk
17	shall remain in effect until rescinded by the majority vote of the legal voters
18	present and voting at an annual or special meeting, duly warned for that
19	purpose.
20	(c) The term of office of a municipal clerk in office on the date a
21	municipality votes to allow the legislative body to appoint a municipal clerk

1	shall expire 45 calendar days after the vote or on the date upon which the

13	may be removed by the legislative body for just cause after notice and hearing.
14	(b) A vote to authorize the legislative body to appoint the treasurer shall
15	remain in effect until rescinded by the majority vote of the legal voters present
16	and voting at an annual or special meeting, duly warned for that purpose.
17	(c) The term of office of a treasurer in office on the date a municipality
18	votes to allow the legislative body to appoint a treasurer shall expire
19	45 calendar days after the vote or on the date upon which the legislative body
20	appoints a treasurer under this section, whichever occurs first, unless a petition

1	for reconsideration or rescission is filed in accordance with section 2661 of this

8	Sec. 4. 24 V.S.A. § 1686 is amended to read:
9	§ 1686. PENALTY
10	(a) At any time in their discretion, town auditors may, and if requested by
11	the selectboard, shall, examine and adjust the accounts of any town officer
12	authorized by law to receive or disburse money belonging to the town.
13	(b) If the town has voted to eliminate the office of auditor, the public
14	accountant employed by the selectboard shall perform the duties of the town
15	auditors under subsection (a) of this section upon request of the selectboard.
16	(c) Any town officer who willfully refuses or neglects to submit his or her
17	books, accounts, vouchers, or tax bills to the auditors or the public accountant
18	upon request, or to furnish all necessary information in relation thereto, shall:
19	(1) be personally liable for a civil penalty in the amount of \$100.00 per
20	day until he or she submits or furnishes the requested materials or information;
21	(2) be ineligible to reelection for the year ensuing; and
