5	and recommends that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting
6	clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. 20 V.S.A. § 4651 is amended to read:
8	§ 4651. PROHIBITED DISCLOSURE OF PERSONALLY IDENTIFYING
9	INFORMATION
10	(a) As used in this section:
11	(1) "Personally identifying information" means information concerning
12	a person's sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, marital status, race, color,
13	religion, national origin, immigration status, age, or disability or a person's
14	information maintained in the statewide voter checklist.
15	(2) "Public agency" has shall have the same meaning as in
16	1 V.S.A. § 317 and shall include all officers, employees, agents, and
17	independent contractors of the public agency.
18	(b) A public agency shall not:
19	(1) collect information regarding the religious beliefs, practices, or
20	affiliation of any individual for the purpose of registration of an individual
21	based on his or her religious beliefs, practices, or affiliations;

1	(2) knowingly disclose personally identifying information to any federal
2	agency or official for the purpose of:
3	(A) registration of an individual based on his or her personally
4	identifying information;
5	(B) publicly disclosing an individual's personally identifying
6	information maintained in the statewide voter checklist; or
7	(C) comparing an individual's personally identifying information
8	maintained in the statewide voter checklist to personally identifying
9	information contained in other federal or state databases; or
10	(3) use public agency money, facilities, property, equipment, or
11	personnel to assist in creating or enforcing any federal government program for
12	the registration of an individual based on his or her personally identifying
13	information.
14	(c) Any section, term, or provision of an agreement in existence on the
15	effective date of this section that conflicts with subsection (b) of this section
16	shall be invalidated on that date to the extent of the conflict.
17	(d) Nothing in this section is intended to prohibit or impede any public
18	agency from complying with the lawful requirements of 8 U.S.C. §§ 1373 and
19	1644. To the extent any State or local law enforcement policy or practice
20	conflicts with the lawful requirements of 8 U.S.C. §§ 1373 and 1644, said the
21	policy or practice is, to the extent of such conflict, abolished.

1	(e) Nothing in this section is intended to prohibit or impede any public
2	agency from disclosing or exchanging aggregated information that cannot be
3	used to identify an individual with any other public agency or federal agency
4	or official.
5	Sec. 2. 17 V.S.A. § 2154 is amended to read:
6	§ 2154. STATEWIDE VOTER CHECKLIST
7	(a) The Secretary of State shall establish maintain a uniform and
8	nondiscriminatory, statewide voter registration checklist. This checklist shall
9	serve as the official voter registration list for all elections in the State. In
10	establishing maintaining the statewide voter checklist, the Secretary shall:
11	(1) limit the <u>a</u> town clerk to adding, modifying, or deleting applicant and
12	voter information on the portion of the checklist for that clerk's municipality;
13	(2) limit access to the statewide voter checklist for a local elections
14	official to verifying if the applicant is registered in another municipality in the
15	State by a search for the individual voter;
16	(3) notify a local elections official when a voter registered in that
17	official's district registers in another voting district so that the voter may be
18	removed from that district's official's district checklist;
19	(4) provide adequate security to prevent unauthorized access to the
20	checklist; and

1	(5) ensure the compatibility and comparability of information on the
2	checklist with information contained in the Department of Motor Vehicles'
3	computer systems.
4	(b) A registered voter's month and day of birth, driver's license or
5	nondriver identification number, telephone number, e-mail address, and the
6	last four digits of his or her Social Security number shall be kept confidential
7	and are exempt from public copying and inspection and copying under the
8	Public Records Act.
