7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to remove
8	cosmetology-related requirements from the requirements necessary to become
9	licensed as a barber.
10 11	An act relating to removing cosmetology requirements from barbering licensure
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 26 V.S.A. chapter 6 is amended to read:
14	CHAPTER 6. BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS
15	§ 271. DEFINITIONS
16	For the purposes of As used in this chapter:
17	(1) "Barbering" means engaging in the continuing performance, for
18	compensation, of any of the following activities: cutting, shampooing, or
19	styling hair; shaving the face, shaving around the vicinity of the ears and
20	neckline, or trimming facial hair; or basic facials, skin care, or scalp massages;

1	and, if trained in accordance with rules adopted by the Board, bleaching,
2	coloring, straightening, permanent waving hair, or similar work by any means,
3	with hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances. Barbering also
4	includes esthetics.
5	(2) "Basic facial" means basic cleansing, toning, or moisturizing.
6	(3) "Board" means the board of barbers and cosmetologists Board of
7	Barbers and Cosmetologists.
8	(3)(4) "Cosmetology" means engaging in the continuing performance,
9	for compensation, of any of the following activities:
10	(A) Work on the hair of any person, including dressing, curling,
11	waving, cleansing, cutting, bleaching, coloring, or similar work by any means,
12	with hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances.
13	(B) Esthetics.
14	(C) Manicuring.
15	(4) "Disciplinary action" or "disciplinary cases" includes any action
16	taken by the board against a licensee, registrant, or applicant premised upon a
17	finding of wrongdoing or unprofessional conduct by the licensee or applicant.
18	It includes all sanctions of any kind, excluding obtaining injunctions, but
19	including issuing warnings, other similar sanctions and ordering restitution.
20	(5) "Esthetics" means massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating,
21	beautifying, or otherwise working on the scalp, face, or neck, by using

1	cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or creams. "Esthetics" does
2	not include the sale or application of cosmetics to customers in retail stores or
3	customers' homes.

5	(7) "Manicuring" or "nail technician practice" means the nonmedical
6	treatment of a person's fingernails or toenails or the skin in the vicinity of the
7	nails, and includes the use of cosmetic preparations or appliances.

9	§ 277. QUALIFICATIONS; BARBER
10	(a) A person shall be eligible for licensure as a barber if the person:
11	(1) is at least 18 years of age;
12	(2) has a high school or general educational development diploma, and;
13	(3) has satisfactorily completed:
14	(A) an accredited barber school program; or
15	(B) has satisfactorily completed an apprenticeship of not less than
16	12 months and not more than 36 months consisting of a minimum of 2,000
17	hours and a maximum of 3,000 hours in a manner prescribed by the board
18	Board in addition to areas of study, prescribed by the board, Board by rule, has
19	a high school or general educational development diploma,; and
20	(4) has passed the examination described in section 283 of this title
21	<u>chapter</u> .

1	(b)(1) The board Board shall issue a limited barbering license, with an
2	endorsement for cutting, shampooing, and styling hair and for mustache and
3	beard trimming, to any person incarcerated in a state State correctional facility
4	who completes, while under the direct personal supervision of a barber
5	licensed by the board Board, a course of training of not less than 10 hours in
6	cutting, shampooing, and styling hair and trimming of mustache and beard.
7	(2) Such a limited license shall be valid only within a state State
8	correctional facility.
9	(3) No The Board shall not charge fees shall be charged for a limited
10	license issued under this subsection.
11	§ 278. QUALIFICATIONS; COSMETOLOGIST
12	A person shall be eligible for licensure as a cosmetologist if the person:
13	(1) is at least 18 years of age;
14	(2) has a high school or general educational development diploma, and:
15	(3) has satisfactorily completed the following:
16	(1)(A) a course of study of at least 1,500 hours at a school of
17	cosmetology approved by an accrediting body recognized by the United States
18	<u>U.S.</u> Department of Education or approved by the <del>board</del> <u>Board</u> under standards
19	that the board Board has adopted by rule and passage of the examination
20	described in section 283 of this title; or

1	(2)(B) an apprenticeship of not less than 12 months and not more than
2	36 months consisting of not less than 2,000 hours and a maximum of 3,000
3	hours in a manner prescribed by the board Board in addition to courses, as
4	prescribed by the board Board by rule;; and
5	(4) passage of has passed the examination described in section 283 of
6	this title chapter.

8	§ 281. POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL OF BARBERING AND
9	COSMETOLOGY; CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL
10	(a) No $\underline{A}$ school of barbering or cosmetology shall $\underline{not}$ be granted a
11	certificate of approval unless the school:
12	* * *
13	(4) Requires a school term of training:
14	(A) in the case of a school of barbering, of not less than 1,000 hours
15	for a complete course that includes all or the majority of the practices of
16	barbering, and includes practical demonstrations and theoretical studies in
17	sanitation, sterilization, the use of antiseptics, and the use of electrical
18	appliances, consistent with the practical and theoretical requirements
19	applicable to barbering or any practice of barbering; and
20	(B) in the case of a school of cosmetology, requires a school term of
21	training of not less than 1,500 hours for a complete course that includes all or

1	the majority of the practices of cosmetology, and includes practical
2	demonstrations and theoretical studies in sanitation, sterilization, and the use of
3	antiseptics, cosmetics, and electrical appliances, consistent with the practical
4	and theoretical requirements applicable to cosmetology or any practice of
5	cosmetology.

7	Sec. 2. BOARD OF BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS; RULES
8	The Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists shall amend its rules governing
9	the practice of barbering in accordance with Sec. 1 of this act on or before the
10	effective date of that section.
11	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATES
12	This act shall take effect on passage, except that Sec. 1 shall take effect on
13	<u>January 1, 2019.</u>
