4	Subject: Health; Medicaid; accountable care organizations; reports
5	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require the
6	Department of Vermont Health Access to provide periodic reports to the
7	Health Reform Oversight Committee and the legislative committees of
8	jurisdiction regarding implementation of a one-year pilot project agreement
9	between the Department and an accountable care organization. It would also
10	direct the Green Mountain Care Board to keep the same committees
11	apprised of its progress in implementing the All-Payer Model and
12	preparing to regulate accountable care organizations.
13 14	An act relating to Next Generation Medicaid ACO pilot project reporting requirements
15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
16	Sec. 1. NEXT GENERATION MEDICAID ACO PILOT PROJECT
17	REPORTS
18	(a) On or before June 15, September 15, and December 15, 2017, the
19	Department of Vermont Health Access shall provide to the House Committees

1	Appropriations and on Health and Welfare, and the Health Reform
2	Oversight Committee written updates on the implementation of the Next
3	Generation Medicaid ACO pilot using a reporting template developed by the
4	Department in consultation with the Office of Legislative Council and the Joint
5	Fiscal Office. The updates shall include the following information:
6	(1) the amount of Medicaid funds provided by the Department to the
7	accountable care organization in each of the three months preceding the month
8	of the report, except that for the June report, the Department shall report the
9	amount of Medicaid funds provided in each month since the beginning of the
10	pilot;
11	(2) the amount of funds expended by the accountable care organization
12	on behalf of attributed Medicaid beneficiaries in each of the three months
13	preceding the month of the report, except that for the June report, the
14	Department shall report the amount of funds expended on behalf of attributed
15	Medicaid beneficiaries in each month since the beginning of the pilot;
16	(3) the extent to which the accountable care organization has met the
17	quality indicators specified in the Next Generation Medicaid ACO pilot project
18	agreement signed on February 1, 2017;
19	(4) the extent to which the Department and the accountable care
20	organization have met the reporting benchmarks identified in the

1	Department's Next Generation Medicaid ACO Year 1 (2017) Operational
2	Timeline;
3	(5) to the extent data is available, a comparison of:
4	(A) utilization of health care services by service category for the
5	Medicaid population attributed to the ACO during the pilot year with the
6	utilization of services for the same population in prior years; and
7	(B) utilization of health care services by service category for the
8	Medicaid population attributed to the ACO during the pilot year with the
9	utilization of services for Medicaid beneficiaries not attributed to the ACO;
10	(6) statistical information regarding the number of patient and provider
11	complaints, grievances, and appeals for attributed Medicaid beneficiaries and
12	participating providers, as well as any available information regarding patient
13	and provider satisfaction with the pilot;
14	(7) current information on the size of the participating provider network
15	since the beginning of the pilot and since the previous report, if applicable; and
16	(8) any change in the size of the Medicaid population attributed to the
17	ACO since the beginning of the pilot and since the previous report, if
18	applicable.
19	(b) In addition to the written updates required by subsection (a) of this
20	section, the Department of Vermont Health Access shall provide testimony on
21	implementation of the Next Generation Medicaid ACO pilot project at a

1	meeting of the Health Reform Oversight Committee at least once every two
2	months or more frequently if so requested by the Committee. The testimony
3	shall include the information specified in subsection (a) of this section, as well
4	as any other information the Department deems relevant to the Committee's
5	oversight of the pilot project during the 2017 legislative interim. The
6	Committee shall also provide an opportunity for the Office of the Health Care
7	Advocate to testify at the same meetings as the Department regarding issues
8	related to the pilot project, including information on complaints, grievances,
9	and appeals reported to or requiring investigation or other action by the Office
10	Sec. 2. ALL-PAYER MODEL AND ACCOUNTABLE CARE
11	ORGANIZATION REPORTS
12	On or before June 15, September 15, and December 15, 2017, the
13	Green Mountain Care Board shall provide to the House Committees on
14	Appropriations and on Health Care, the Senate Committees on
15	Appropriations and on Health and Welfare, and the Health Reform
16	Oversight Committee written updates on the Board's progress in meeting
17	the benchmarks identified in the Board's Year 0 (2017) All-Payer ACO
18	Model Timeline regarding implementation of the All-Payer Model and
19	the Board's preparations for regulating accountable care organizations.
20	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
21	This act shall take effect on passage.
