5	First: In Sec. 1, health information technology; health information
6	exchange; reports, in subsections (b), (c), and (d), following "on Health Care,"
7	by inserting "on Energy and Technology,"
8	Second: In Sec. 3, 18 V.S.A. § 9352, by striking out subsection (a) in its
9	entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new subsection (a) to read as follows:
10	(a)(1) Governance. The Vermont Information Technology Leaders, Inc.
11	(VITL) Board of Directors shall consist of no fewer than nine nor more than 14
12	members. The term of each member shall be two years, except that of the
13	members first appointed, approximately one-half shall serve a term of one year
14	and approximately one-half shall serve a term of two years, and members shall
15	continue to hold office until their successors have been duly appointed. The
16	Board of Directors shall comprise the following:
17	(A) one member of the General Assembly, appointed jointly by the
18	Speaker of the House and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, who shall
19	be entitled to the same per diem compensation and expense reimbursement
20	pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 406 as provided for attendance at sessions of the
21	General Assembly;

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1	(B) one individual appointed by the Governor;
2	(C) one representative of the business community;
3	(D) one representative of health care consumers;
4	(E) one representative of Vermont hospitals;
5	(F) one representative of Vermont physicians;
6	(G) one practicing clinician licensed to practice medicine in
7	Vermont;
8	(H) one representative of a health insurer licensed to do business in
9	Vermont;
10	(I) the President of VITL, who shall be an ex officio, nonvoting
11	<del>member;</del>
12	(J) two individuals familiar with health information technology, at
13	least one of whom shall be the chief technology officer for a health care
14	provider; and
15	(K) two at-large members
16	representatives of the business community, of health care consumers, of
17	Vermont hospitals, of Vermont-licensed clinicians, and of health insurers
18	licensed to offer plans in Vermont, as well as individuals familiar with health
19	information technology, including, to the extent practicable, one or more
20	individuals who are or have served as the chief technology officer for a health
21	care facility.

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1	(2) Except for the members appointed pursuant to subdivisions (1)(A)
2	and (B) of this subsection, whenever a vacancy on the Board occurs, the
3	members of the Board of Directors then serving shall appoint a new member
4	who shall meet the same criteria as the member he or she replaces.
5	Third: In Sec. 8a, 2 V.S.A. chapter 18, in § 614, by striking out subdivision
6	(e)(1) in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new subdivision $(e)(1)$ to
7	read as follows:
8	(1) The Committee shall elect a chair and vice chair from among its
9	members and shall adopt rules of procedure. The Chair shall rotate biennially
10	between the House and Senate members.
11	Fourth: In Sec. 8a, 2 V.S.A. chapter 18, in § 614, by striking out
12	subdivision (e)(3) in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new subdivision
13	(e)(3) to read as follows:
14	(3) The Committee may meet when the General Assembly is not in
15	session or at the call of the Chair.
