7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes that the
8	Commissioner of Vermont Health Access contract with an independent
9	consultant to assess opportunities to reduce the benefit cliffs imposed by
10	Vermont's public benefit structure.
11	An act relating to the assessment of Vermont's public benefit structure
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. PURPOSE
14	In recognition of the hardship that benefit cliffs pose on working
15	Vermonters receiving public assistance, the General Assembly seeks to find a
16	solution that will reduce benefit cliffs and will enable individuals to transition
17	gradually from public assistance to self-sustaining employment. It is the
18	intention of the General Assembly that the solution be economically feasible
19	for the State, empower Vermonters to enter and remain in the workforce, and
20	minimize disruption to participating beneficiaries.

1	Sec. 2. PUBLIC BENEFIT CONSULTANT
2	(a) The Commissioner of Vermont Health Access shall contract with an
3	independent consultant who has expertise in the fields of finance and human
4	services to evaluate the State's public benefit structure and to recommend
5	methods for diminishing the benefit cliffs experienced by working Vermonters
6	receiving public assistance.
7	(b) The independent consultant shall deliver a report to the General
8	Assembly on or before January 15, 2018 that shall specifically:
9	(1) catalogue existing benefit cliffs embedded within Vermont's public
10	assistance benefit structure and identify where specific State policy changes
11	could diminish financial hardships experienced by working Vermonters
12	receiving public assistance; and
13	(2) recommend how Vermont's public assistance benefit structure could
14	be transformed to transition individuals gradually from public assistance to
15	self-sustaining employment.
16	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
17	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
