6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to allow the

11 12	An act relating to the provision of traumatic brain injury services to family members of active duty service members
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. RULEMAKING; ELIGIBILITY AND APPLICATION PROCESS
15	FOR TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY SERVICES
16	(a) The Commissioner of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living shall
17	adopt rules pursuant to 3 V.S.A. chapter 25 to enable the dependent family
18	member of an active duty service member to remain on the waitlist for
19	traumatic brain injury services funded through the State's home and

20 <u>community-based services Medicaid waiver regardless of the dependent family</u>

1	member's absence from the State due to the service member's out-of-state
2	military assignment, provided that:
3	(1) the dependent family member is currently eligible for traumatic
4	brain injury services as prescribed by the Department; and
5	(2) the active duty service member is a legal resident of Vermont.
6	(b) Upon an eligible dependent family member's return to the State at the
7	conclusion of the service member's out-of-state military assignment, the
8	dependent family member shall retain his or her position on the waitlist for
9	traumatic brain injury services funded through the State's home and
10	community-based services Medicaid waiver or shall receive services if during
11	his or her absence from the State he or she moved to a position of priority on
12	the waitlist.
13	(c) As used in this section, "legal resident" means the state in which the
14	active duty service member:
15	(1)(A) pays taxes;
16	(B) is registered to vote; or
17	(C) holds a valid driver's license; and
18	(2) plans to return after out-of-state military assignment.
19	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
20	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
