Purpose of Receivership:

- ► Ensure safe surrounding, adequate care and humane treatment of residents
- Safeguard the health, safety and continuity of care to residents
- Protect residents from the adverse health effects caused by abrupt or unsuitable transfer of residents

History: 2 Receiverships

- Both involved licensed level III residential care homes
- ► Most recent receivership: April, 2016
- Both receiverships resulted in transfer of residents and eventual closure

DAIL Independent Review of 2016 Receivership

- Goal: Learn from past experience and improve going forward to prevent adverse outcomes for residents and providers
 - Examine issues that led to appointment of receiver;
 - Review overall implementation of receivership;
 - Obtain recommendations to improve receiverships going forward

Independent Review

- Interview residents, Receiver, State staff, State Long Term Care Ombudsman and Community Partners
- Review relevant documentation
- Research practices in other states
- Resulted in a number of recommendations, some require legislative change

Proposed changes to current legislation:

- Allow entities, in addition to individuals to serve as receivers:
 - Responsibilities of Receiver are broad and require a variety of skills - health care, financial management, human resources.
 - ► Can be challenging for one individual to manage.
 - ► Review identified organizations that specialize in receivership and provide the broad array of capabilities needed to effectively manage.

Proposed Changes - cont'd

- Provide for information sharing:
 - ► State with Receiver
 - ► Receiver with State Long Term Care Ombudsman

- Amends §7217 Duties of DAIL broader than the Licensing Agency
 - ► Commissioner's Office, Licensing Agency and Adult Services
 - ▶ Provide technical assistance & consultation to Receiver

Proposed Changes - cont'd

- ▶ Identifies funds available to compensate Receiver:
 - Expenditures to be paid first from facility revenues
 - ▶ Other funds/fees may be used when:
 - ► Revenues of facility are not sufficient
 - ► No other source of payment available
 - ► If State uses funds/fees, gives the State priority over all other claims

Proposed Changes - cont'd

- ► Allows for Rule Making:
 - ▶ DAIL in consultation with Office of Attorney General
 - Addresses key recommendation to clarify roles and responsibilities
