2	The Committee on Judiciary to which was referred Senate Bill No. 150
3	entitled "An act relating to automated license plate recognition systems"
4	respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the
5	House propose to the Senate that the bill be amended as follows:
6	First: In Sec. 1, at the end of subsection (b), by striking out "2020" and
7	inserting in lieu thereof "2019"
8	Second: By inserting two new sections to be Secs. 2–3 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 2. AUTOMATED LICENSE PLATE RECOGNITION SYSTEMS;
10	AUDITOR EXAMINATION OF COMPLIANCE
11	(a) On or before January 15, 2019, with respect to data collected by
12	Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR) systems, the Auditor of
13	Accounts (Auditor) shall:
14	(1) examine requests for "historical data" as defined in 23 V.S.A. § 1607
15	that resulted in release of historical data to the requester by the Vermont
16	Intelligence Center (VIC), and shall examine such additional records as may be
17	required, to enable the Auditor to determine whether the request and the
18	release complied with requirements of 23 V.S.A. § 1607(c)(2); and
19	(2) submit a written report to the House and Senate Committees on
20	Judiciary and on Transportation summarizing the findings of the examination
21	required under this subsection.

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1	(b) Notwithstanding any exemption under the Public Records Act (PRA) or
2	other provision of State law to the contrary, a public agency shall release to the
3	Auditor records that the Auditor may need in order to conduct the examination
4	required under subsection (a) of this section. After receiving any record that is
5	exempt from public inspection and copying under the PRA, the Auditor shall
6	have the authority and the obligation to assert the PRA exemption if the
7	Auditor receives a request to inspect or copy the record.
8	Sec. 3. REPORT ON PLANS FOR USE OF STATIONARY AUTOMATED
9	LICENSE PLATE RECOGNITION SYSTEMS
10	On or before January 15, 2019, the Commander of the Vermont Intelligence
11	Center shall submit a written report to the House and Senate Committees on
12	Judiciary and on Transportation summarizing the plans or activities of all State
13	and local public agencies, if any, that are planning to install or have installed
14	stationary automated license plate recognition (ALPR) systems. The report
15	shall include the planned or existing locations of all stationary ALPR systems
16	in the State, the criteria used to select the locations, and the expected or actual
17	costs and benefits of the installations.
