<b>New Hampshire</b>	\$400-\$1,500 annual fee	state	2 yr.	4 yr.	6 yr.	6 yr.	Fees are \$400, \$750 and \$1,500 for low, significant and high hazard dams, respectively; no fees for "non-menace" dams.

Owner is charged \$660 for all state inspections.
