RE: S.260

We, as you may know, operate under the regulation of the new Required Agricultural Practices (RAP). We do this not because we are required to but because we care about water quality and what it will mean to future generations. Farmers are first and foremost, caretakers of the land. We consider the RAP's as the handbook for the "boots on the ground".

The misinformation that has been stated in the Legislative arena and media is not factual and no one is taking the time to know what is the true. We as the farmers on the ground quite frankly tell you what the reality is on our farms and with the State Agencies. The media misconstrues and twists the real data and situation to further the agenda of activists which are only pushing a political agenda. S.260 is not needed rather the Legislature should allow time for the RAP's and other water quality projects work. You have recently seen that even the EPA acknowledges that Vermont is making progress.

We do appreciate the Committee's position to remove the section on "Citizen Suits". VAAFM and ANR have aggressively enforced against instances of non-compliance.
