6	(a) The Commissioner of Labor, in consultation with the Secretary of
7	Human Services, and the Commissioners of Financial Regulation and of
8	Taxes, shall study the potential creation of a Tax-Free Vermont Baby Benefit
9	Program that would provide a grant or a form of income replacement to
10	Vermont parents who take unpaid leave following the birth of a child. In
11	particular, the Commissioner shall identify and examine:
12	(1) the potential costs to the State of providing a maximum benefit of
13	between \$1,000.00 and \$2,000.00 per birth;
14	(2) various means of providing the benefit to new families, including
15	through a lump-sum payment or weekly wage replacement;
16	(3) possible limitations on eligibility for the benefit, including residency
17	or employment;
18	(4) the potential costs and other impacts of providing the benefit for
19	bonding following adoption or the placement of a foster child;

1	(5) various models for administering the program in an efficient, cost-
2	effective, and user-friendly manner without requiring significant up-front
3	expenditures by the State; and
4	(6) possible funding sources including uncollected bottle deposits,
5	unclaimed property; legal settlements benefiting the State; an opportunity for
6	individuals to designate funds on their income tax returns; a tax on specific
7	goods or services; or an income tax surcharge.
8	(b) On or before January 15, 2018, the Commissioner of Labor shall submit
9	a written report to the General Assembly with his or her findings and a
10	recommendation for legislative action necessary to create the Tax-Free
11	Vermont Baby Benefit Program.
