8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require the
9	Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets to adopt by rule best management
10	practices, standards, procedures, and requirements relating to the sale, use,
11	storage, or disposal of treated articles that will have a hazardous or long-term
12	deleterious effect on the environment, present a likely risk to human health, or
13	are dangerous. The bill would require that the rules be based, in part, on the
14	recommendation of the State Pollinator Protection Committee.

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1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

5	(a) The Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets, upon the

10	the Pesticide Advisory Council has determined that will have a hazardous or

15	COMPLETION
16	(a) On or before September 1, 2017, the Secretary of Agriculture, Food and
17	Markets shall commence the rulemaking required under 6 V.S.A § 1105a
18	regarding the regulation of treated articles.
19	(b) The Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets shall adopt the final
20	rule under 6 V.S.A. § 1105a regarding the regulation of treated articles on or
21	before September 1, 2018.

1	(c) Prior to commencing rulemaking under 6 V.S.A. § 1105a, the Secretary
2	of Agriculture, Food and Markets shall consult the report of the Pollinator
3	Protection Committee (Committee) required under 2016 Acts and Resolves
4	No. 83, Sec. 1 and shall propose in the rules required under 6 V.S.A. § 1105a
5	requirements to implement the recommendations of the Committee, including
6	any recommended best management practices for application of neonicotinoid
7	pesticides in a manner that avoids harm to pollinators.

9	This act shall take effect on passage.
