"Coordinated, comprehensive planning process and policy framework" 24VSA§4302(b)

State Policies, Act250, etc.



Rules and policies that must be applied evenly on a statewide bases

Regional Plan



Highlights major regional issues with a "broad brush" to accommodate differences among municipalities

Local Plan



Fine tuned to the specific issues of a single municipality, or areas within a municipality

Local Regulation: Types of Review

Type of Review	Function of Review
Permitted Use	Established by right, provided structure meets dimensional/district standards
Site Plan Review	Addresses site layout/design; may be required for some permitted uses.
Conditional Use Review	Reviews impacts to determine if use is compatible with area (traffic, infrastructure, etc.)
Subdivision	Reviews the layout and configuration of new lots and associated improvements/infrastructure
Planned Unit Developments	Allows for flexible design and/or density bonuses, often in exchange for furthering goals of the Muni Plan.

What is Site Plan Review? 24VSA§4416

- Addresses issues related to site layout/design.
- Site Plan Review Standards usually involve objective standards defined in the local bylaws, such as:
 - Parking, Landscaping, and Screening
 - Stormwater Management
 - Signs
 - Exterior Lighting and Utilities
 - Vehicular, Pedestrian and Bicycle Circulation and Access
- Does NOT include subjective "Character" standard found in Conditional Use Review
- Note: Statute authorizes municipalities to enable "Administrative" Site Plan Approval meaning some site plans can be approved via a administrative permit rather than a hearing before the DRB.
