The Good And The Bad

- The BDCC is extremely pleased with the support it has received for its programs and initiatives these past Six years.
 - It has taken 6+ years to build the systems and capacity we are able to leverage in support of our regional workforce development efforts.
 - The cycle of grants are often unpredictable, their timing does not allow for alignment with budgeting, affecting resource allocation. This leads to staffing uncertainty in a sector where we NEED stability.



How is this being funded?

ACCD, Regional, Municipal & Foundations

- Support for our Southern Vermont Workforce Center of Excellence is provided by:
 - ACCD contracts with SeVEDS and BDCC to provide economic development and regional development services.
 - The E.D.A funded a Windham/Bennington County Grant Award for the Southern Vermont Marketing and Recruitment Study. Implementation funding through Windham County Economic Development Program (WCEDP) funds has been denied to date.
 - McClure & Vermont Community Foundations
 - Funding provides unrestricted capacity to do systems-wide and cross-sector work that some grants do not provide, or allow. These funding cycles are both flexible and consistent.
 - Southern Vermont Young Professionals Group
 - Over 350 members, funded by ACCD, BDCC & Municipal Fundraising Efforts

DOL Funded Initiatives

- Currently our DOL Funds Support:
 - Fast Tracks to Success through the Workforce & Education Training Fund Grant
 - This grant was set to expire halfway through spring semester- recently grant opportunity canceled
 - Six Colleges Internship Program- Collaborative internship Program
 - Grant Schedule expires in February, just as spring semester gets underway
 - BDCC Business Roundtable Initiative Regional Workforce Partnership
 - Aligns closely with ACCD Workforce Needs Assessment, Talent Pipeline Management, and other D.E.D resources and goals.

• 2011 Southeastern Vermont Economic Development Strategies Organization Formed, with support from the state to plan for the economic impacts resulting from the closure of VT Yankee. The long-term strategic economic plan developed included strategies to grow the size and quality of the regional workforce.

 - Recruitment






The BDCC has been successful in partnering with both the ACCD and the VT Department of Labor in support of our workforce programs.
