EARLY LEARNING CHALLENGE GRANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS FROM JANUARY 2014 – DECEMBER 2017

- Four focus categories
 - Improve Quality and Access
 - Invest in the Early Childhood Workforce
 - Empower Communities
 - Improve Accountability: How Do We Know We Made a Difference?



Improve Quality And Access



- Improved and implemented standards for Specialized Child Care providers
- Updated Vermont Early Learning Standards, birth – grade 3, including web-based materials and statewide training
- Expanded Strengthening Families framework
- Increased participation in STARS and in higher tiers of STARS specifically

Improve Quality And Access



- Established Help Me Grow
- Expanded Early Multi-Tiered Systems of Support
- Developed PreK Monitoring System design
- Trained in evidence based home visiting models

Invest in the Early Childhood Workforce

- Designed the Vermont Early Childhood Comprehensive Assessment System
- Enabled hundreds of early childhood practitioners to take college level courses
- Surveyed the early childhood workforce



Empower Communities



- Strengthened Building Bright Futures as backbone for early childhood
- 75 early childhood leaders graduated from Early Childhood Leadership Institute
- Promise Communities invested in local leadership, strategies and activities to improve school readiness

Improve Accountability in Early Childhood

- Building Bright Futures designed and implemented Vermont Insights, Vermont's early childhood data hub.
- Design of PreNatal Grade 12 Data Governance program underway.
- Evaluated and validated STARS; revisions underway based on findings
- Kindergarten Readiness Survey evaluated, revised, piloted, and implemented as the new Ready for Kindergarten Survey (R4K!S)
