- Offices in Burlington, Barre, and Rutland



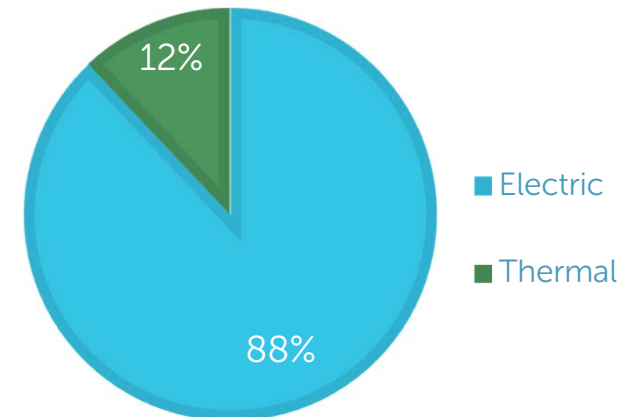
Who We Are

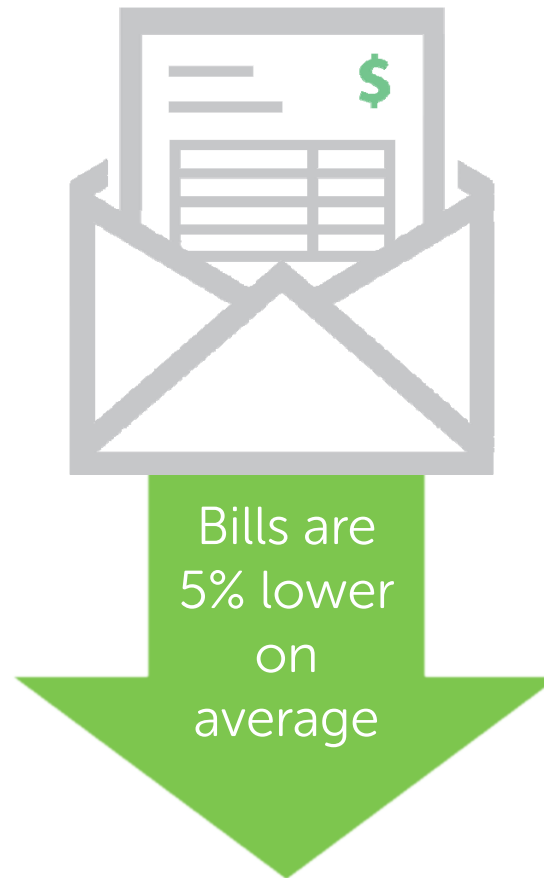
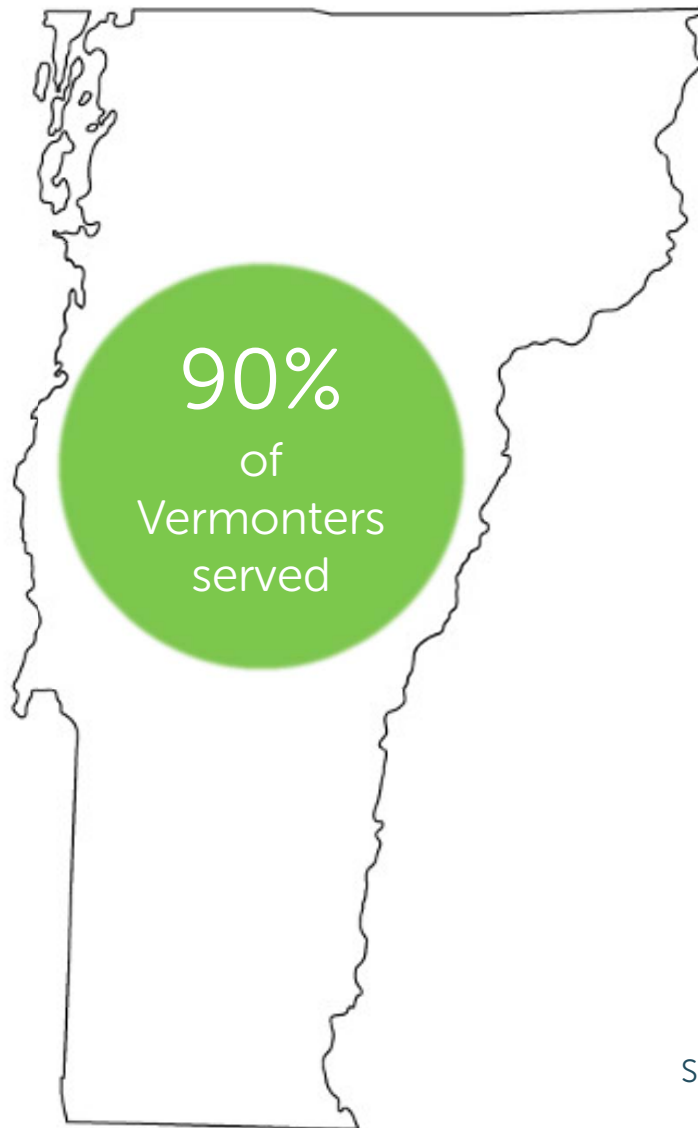

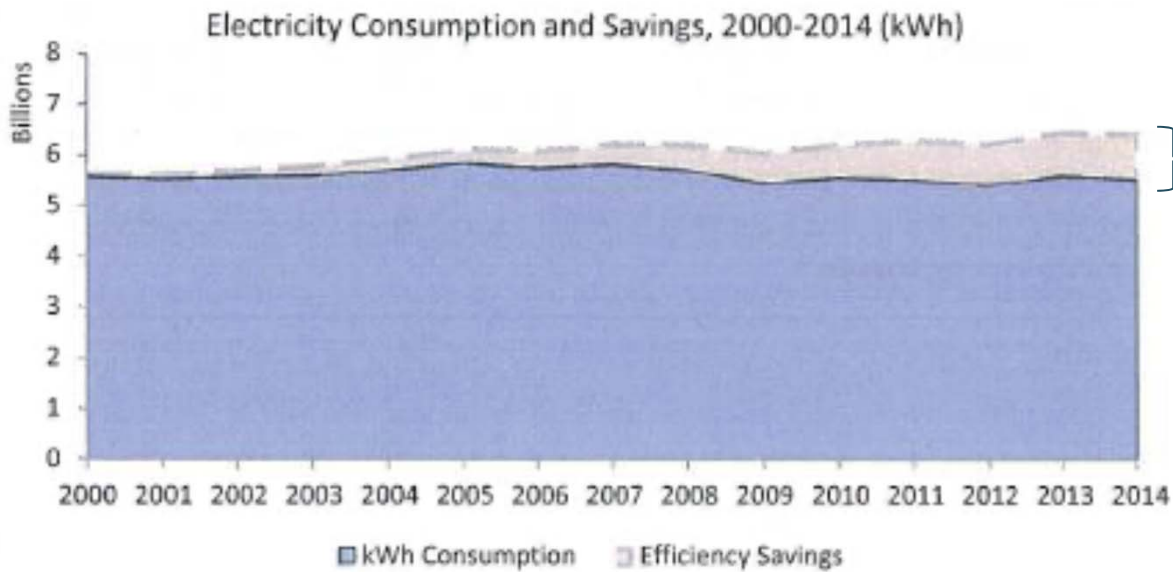

\$473M savings attributable to efficiency programs

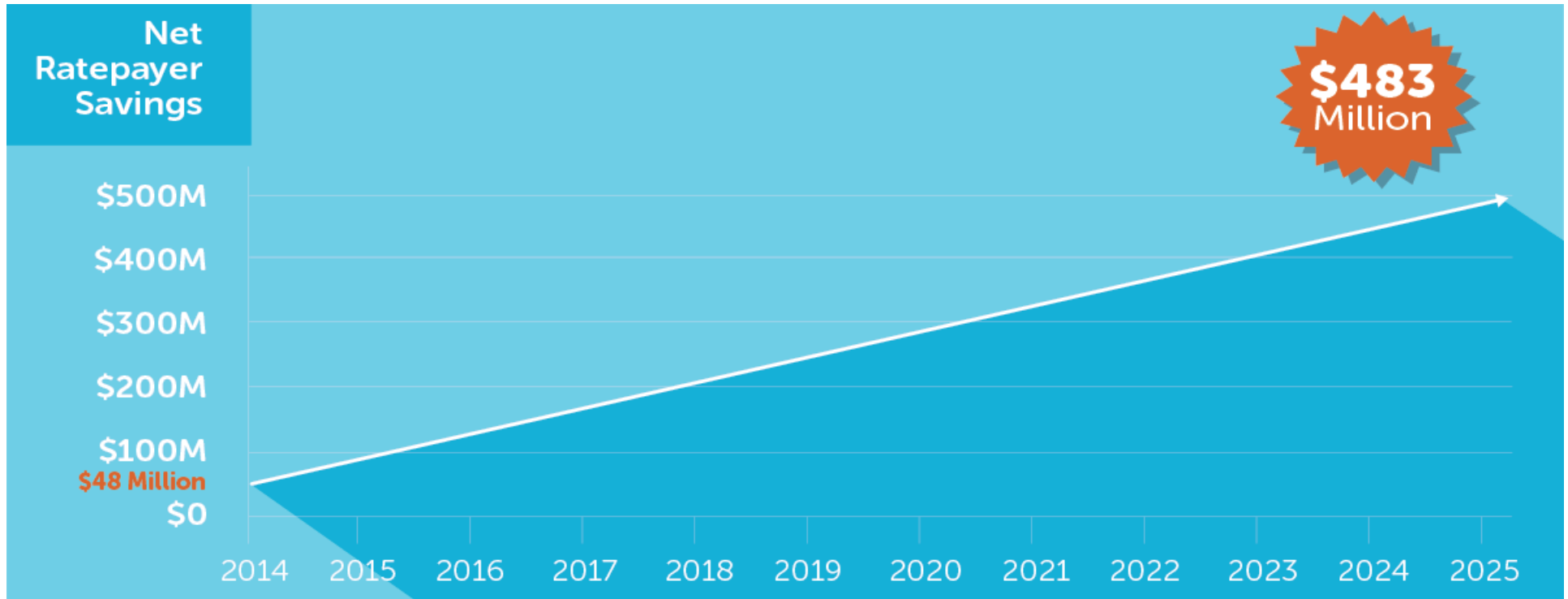

Here's how:



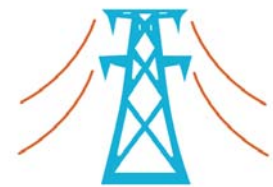
Utilities are buying less power.

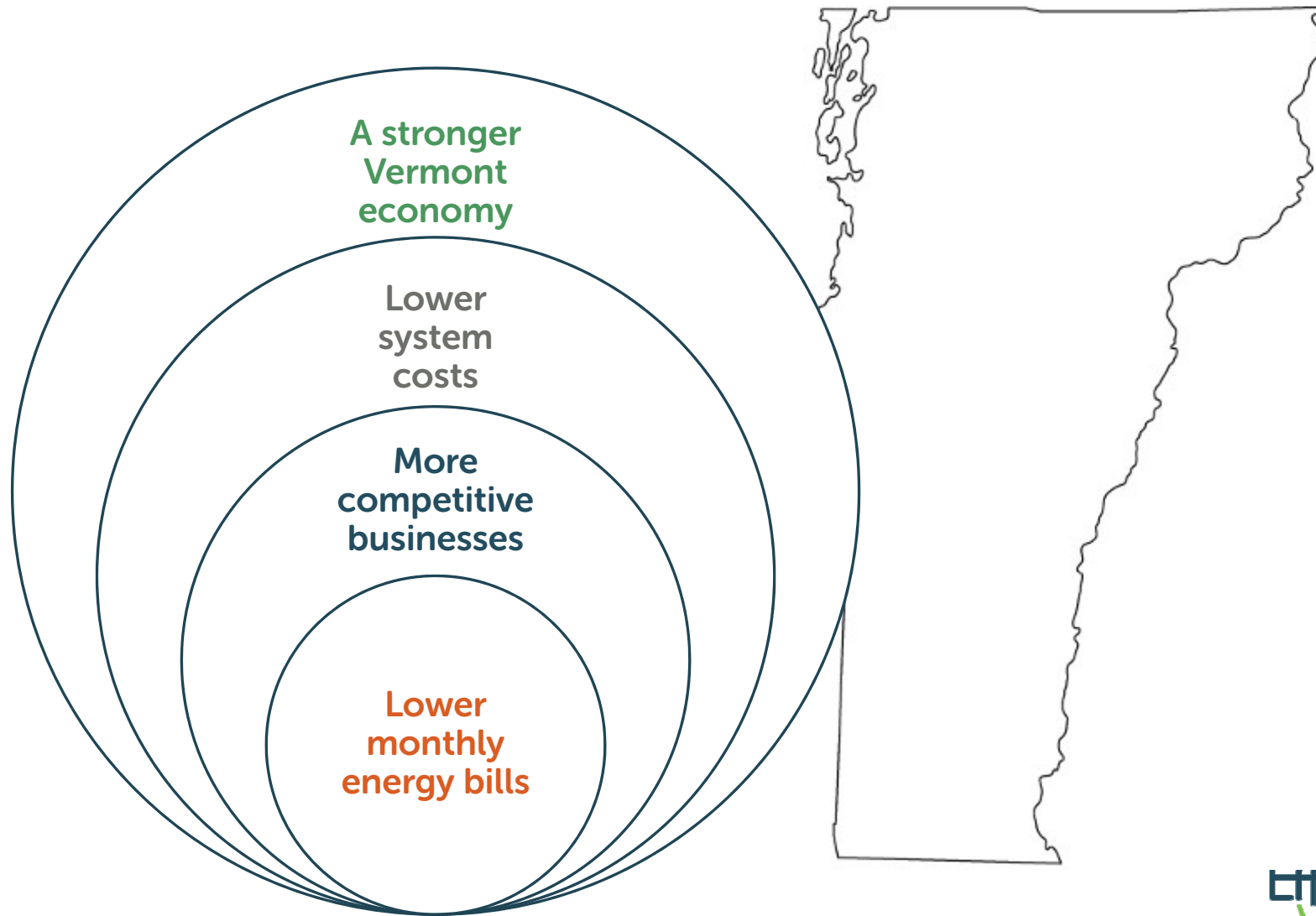
