8	§ 3132. PROHIBITIONS; PERMITS
9	(a) Except as provided in this section, it shall be unlawful for any person,
10	firm, co-partnership, or corporation to do any of the following:
11	(1) Offer offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail or wholesale, or
12	possess fireworks unless the person has been issued a permit by both the U.S.
13	Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms and the municipality in which the
14	person offers for sale and stores the fireworks-;
15	(2) Use use, possess, or explode any fireworks unless the person has
16	been issued a permit to display fireworks pursuant to subsection (c) of this
17	section. or purchase fireworks unless at the time of sale the purchaser presents
18	to the seller for inspection a permit to display fireworks issued pursuant to
19	subsection (c) of this section;
20	(3) Transport fireworks except in interstate commerce. [Repealed.]

1	(4) Offer offer for sale or sell hand-held handheld sparklers as described		
2	in subdivision 3131(1) of this title to a minor-;		
3	(5) Offer offer for sale or sell sparklers that are not in compliance with		
4	the United States U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission regulations-; or		
5	(6) <u>Purchase purchase</u> fireworks.		
6	(b) The state fire marshal State Fire Marshal shall have power to adopt		
7	reasonable rules and regulations for granting permits for supervised public		
8	displays of fireworks by municipalities, fair associations, amusement parks,		
9	and other organizations or groups of individuals.		
10	(c) Any display for which a permit is issued shall be handled by a		
11	competent operator to be approved by the chiefs of police and fire departments		
12	of the municipality in which the display is to be held and shall be of a		
13	character, and so located, discharged, or fired as, in the opinion of the chief of		
14	the fire department, or in a municipality with no fire department, the		
15	selectboard, after proper inspection, shall not be hazardous to property or		
16	endanger any person or persons.		
17	(d) Application for permits shall be made to the chief of the fire		
18	department, or in municipalities with no fire department, the selectboard, in		
19	writing, at least 15 days in advance of the date of the display. After the permit		
20	has been granted, sales, possessions, use, and distribution of fireworks for the		

1	display shall be lawful for that purpose only. No permit granted under this
2	section shall be transferable.
3	(e) A person who sells fireworks at retail shall provide to the purchaser at
4	the time of sale information regarding:
5	(1) the requirement that a permit must be obtained for use, possession,
6	or explosion of fireworks; and
7	(2) the purchaser's obligation to comply with any municipal ordinance
8	regulating use of fireworks.
9	(f)(1) No person shall explode fireworks after 10:00 p.m.
10	(2) A person who violates subdivision (1) of this subsection shall be
11	assessed a civil penalty of not more than \$200.00.
12	(3) Subdivision (1) of this subsection shall not apply:
13	(A) on the following dates: July 3, July 4, December 31, and
14	January 1;
15	(B) to uses permitted by section 3133 of this title; or
16	(C) if the use is permitted by a municipal ordinance.
