7 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to facilitate

8 professional licensing for veterans and members of the U.S. Armed Forces

9 who have a relevant military credential.

10 An act relating to professional licensing for service members and veterans

11 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

12 Sec. 1. 26 V.S.A. § 906 is amended to read:

13 § 906. EXAMINATIONS NOT REQUIRED

14 (a) Licenses for an individual who is licensed by another state or who has

15 received designation by the U.S. Armed Forces as a 12R Electrician or

16 equivalent shall be issued without examination as provided pursuant to this

17 section on payment of the required fee.

18 (b) A master's or journeyman's license, as the case may be, shall be issued

19 to a person to whom a master electrician's license or a journeyman

20 electrician's license has been previously issued by another state, whose

1 standards are equivalent to those of this ~~state~~ State, if under the laws or
2 regulations of the state issuing the license a similar privilege is granted to
3 electricians licensed under the laws of this ~~state~~ State.

4 (c) Except as otherwise provided by law, a journeyman’s license shall be
5 issued to a service member or veteran who:

6 (1) submits a complete application and any documentation required by
7 the Board;

8 (2) has received designation by the U.S. Armed Forces as a 12R
9 Electrician or equivalent; and

10 (3) has completed a minimum of 8,000 hours or four years of active
11 duty field work.

12 (d) As used in this section:

13 (1) “Service member” means an individual who is an active duty
14 member of:

15 (A) the U.S. Armed Forces;

16 (B) a reserve component of the U.S. Armed Forces;

17 (C) the U.S. Coast Guard; or

18 (D) the National Guard of any state.

19 (2) “Veteran” means a former service member who received an
20 honorable discharge or a general discharge under honorable conditions from

1 active duty not more than two years prior to submitting an application for
2 licensure.

4 § 907. RECOGNITION OF EXPERIENCE IN OR OUT OF STATE

5 (a) The ~~board~~ Board, in determining the qualifications of an applicant for a
6 license, may in its discretion give recognition;

7 (1) in the case of an application for a master's license, to the applicant's
8 experience as a licensed journeyman in another state;

9 (2) in the case of an application for a journeyman's license, to an
10 apprenticeship served in another state; or

11 (3) ~~may otherwise give recognition~~ to experience or prior qualifications.

12 (b) The Board, in determining the qualifications of a service member or
13 veteran, as defined pursuant to section 906 of this subchapter, who is applying
14 for a master's license, shall give recognition to the applicant's:

15 (1) experience as a 12R electrician or equivalent in the U.S. Armed
16 Forces; and

17 (2) other experience or prior qualifications.

19 § 2194. EXAMINATIONS NOT REQUIRED; TEMPORARY LICENSES

20 (a)(1) Appropriate licenses without examination may be issued ~~upon the~~
21 payment of the required fee to a person to whom a master plumber's license or

1 a journeyman plumber's license or a specialty license or equivalent has been
2 previously issued by another state or municipality, ~~provided~~ upon the payment
3 of the required fee if:

4 (A) that state or municipality maintained a standard of requirements
5 equivalent to those of this ~~state~~ State; and

6 (B) ~~who~~ the applicant presents satisfactory proof to the ~~board~~ Board
7 that ~~the applicant~~ he or she is a bona fide licensee.

8 (2) An applicant under this subsection shall be exempt from
9 examination only if the applicant holds a license from a foreign state or

19 Plumber or equivalent; and

20 (3) has completed a minimum of 8,000 hours or four years of active
21 duty field work.

1 (2) has received designation by the U.S. Armed Forces as a 66H Nurse
2 or equivalent;

3 (3) has received at least a bachelor’s degree in nursing from a program
4 that is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing
5 (ACEN) or by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) or
6 that is accepted by the U.S. Secretary of Education; and

7 (4) has completed a qualified course in public health nursing or one year
8 of supervised nursing experience.

2 § 1643. NURSING ASSISTANT LICENSURE BY ENDORSEMENT

3 (a) The Board may issue a license to practice as a nursing assistant to an
4 applicant who:

5 (1) is licensed or registered in another U.S. jurisdiction; and

6 (2) ~~who~~ has met the practice requirements set by the Board by rule.

7 (b) Except as otherwise provided by law, the Board shall issue a license to
8 practice as a nursing assistant to an applicant who:

9 (1) is a service member or a veteran;

10 (2) has received designation by the U.S. Armed Forces as a 68W
11 Combat Medic Specialist or equivalent; and

12 (3) is certified as a National Registry Emergency Medical Technician.

6 (b)(1) A person who applies for certification under this section shall:

7 ~~(1)~~(A) complete an application form prescribed by the Commissioner;

8 ~~(2)~~(B) be at least 18 years of age; and

9 ~~(3)~~(C) except as otherwise provided pursuant to subdivision (2) of this
10 subsection (b), pass an examination based on the official inspection manual for
11 each type of vehicle to be inspected and on the inspection requirements for
12 each type of vehicle to be inspected.

4 (b)(1) The rules adopted by the Commissioner shall provide that a service
5 member or veteran who is designated by the U.S. Armed Forces as a 92G
6 Culinary Specialist or equivalent and is certified as a culinarian by the
7 American Culinary Federation shall be deemed to:

8 (A) have knowledge of the prevention of food-borne disease;

9 (B) be able to apply the Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point
10 principles; and

11 (C) have met the criteria for “demonstration of knowledge”
12 requirements set forth by the Department of Health in rule for the purposes of
13 obtaining a food establishment license.

14 (2) As used in this subsection:

15 (A) “Service member” means an individual who is an active duty
16 member of:

17 (i) the U.S. Armed Forces;

18 (ii) a reserve component of the U.S. Armed Forces;
