There are inconsistencies with the DMV for veterans, who are trying to obtain license plates, drivers licenses, etc. If the clerk knows the veteran and is aware that person is a veteran, at times the verification paperwork is not required. Other times a veteran has to verify, they are a veteran, even if it is on the drivers license. This means a person must leave the DMV, contact the State office of Veteran Affairs to obtain the proper paperwork. As it turns out, the DMV, does not track/keep a data base of who is a veteran, once proof is provided. I have spoken with the powers to be there about this. I was informed this was due to the privacy act...but there records of who has licenses, tags etc on file.
